Directions:


From downtown Silver Spring: Go north on Colesville Road (Rte. 29); take a right onto University Blvd. East; then left into the church parking lot A.

From College Park/Takoma Park: Take University Blvd. West. As you approach Rte. 29, move to the far left lane and turn left into church parking lot B. Or pass through Rte. 29 intersection and turn left at the loop just past McDonalds. Proceed on University Blvd. East, pass through Rte. 29 intersection, and quickly get in the far left lane and enter into church parking lot A.

From points north of Four Corners: Proceed south on Rte. 29 and turn right onto University Blvd. West, move into the far left lane and turn left at the loop just past the McDonalds. Proceed through the Rte. 29 intersection, and turn left into church parking lot A.

From Wheaton and points west of Four Corners: Go east on University Blvd. Pass through Route 29 intersection and turn left into parking lot A.

Wherever you park, walk to the southeast corner of the Church and enter Room 204.

This Month at SSCC

November 1 Speaker Night Sasha Vasiljev, A Vicarious Trek



In December of 2011, Sasha Vasiljev judged the SSCC abstracts competition, bringing to bear his experience not only as a photographer but also as an artist

- and one with an unusual background. We were so taken with gallery exhibits of his rain forest photography that we invited him to come speak to us about his travels. We thought he'd give us a virtual tour of his adventures in Costa Rica and South America, but surprise!!! He's taking us to the Himalayas and a trek in Nepal.

Sasha is not only an award-winning photographer but also co-director of Nature & Photo Tours, LLC (www.NaturePhotographyTours.com), which is a boutique tour company specializing in nature, culture, and photography eco-travel in Central, South America, and Nepal. In addition, he is on the faculty of The Washington School of Photography and Washington Studio School and independently teaches classes and workshops (www.AlexanderVasiljev.com) one-on-one or with groups. Sasha works in conceptual, fine art, portraiture, wildlife, and commercial photography and maintains a studio in Dupont Circle.

In the beginning of Sasha's education, he took up fine art, but ultimately received his degree in biology with a major in botany. He went on to curate major tropical orchid collections in his native Ukraine, Russia, and the United States. While living in Moscow, he had the opportunity to study photography under the mentorship of distinguished Russian landscape photographer, Boris Mashkov.

Since immigrating to the US in 1992, Sasha's work has been exhibited in galleries and has been acquired by many private collections worldwide. Several of his photographs are now part of the permanent collection at the Embassy of the Republic of Costa Rica in Washington, DC. His work has also been exhibited at the Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History and has been published in the following magazines: Home & Décor, Nature's Best Photography Magazine, Fine Gardening, Washingtonian, Orchids Magazine, Ecuador Infinito Magazine.

In the coming months, Sasha is offering a number of local workshops, including such topics as portrait editing with Lightroom and Photoshop and external flash photography. For complete workshop descriptions and registration information, go to: http://alexandervasiljev.com/workshops2.html.



Jim Steele works primarily in black and white landscape and in figurative photography. He works in both traditional and digital media and was influenced by Ansel Adams and Edward Weston.

He maintains a studio at the Torpedo Factory Art Center in Alexandria. A frequent lecturer on the subject of fine black and white printing, Steele's photographs are in



many corporate and private collections.

Steele has been a guest lecturer in photography at Georgetown University and has taught for the Art League, the Smithsonian, and Photoworks. He has also taught workshops in fine printing, both traditional and digital. In addition, he has been a presenter at the New England Council of Camera Clubs in Massachusetts.

Apart from his profession as a photographer, Jim Steele has served on the Arts Council of Fairfax County Board of Directors, as Co-chair Visual Arts, for approximately 15 years.

As for education, Steele earned his BS and MS degrees in industrial engineering at the University of Missouri. After university, he served in the Navy and worked for three decades at Boeing and other technical firms. In terms of photographic training, Steele took master photography classes with George Tice, Carson Graves, Christopher James, Cole Weston, Joyce Tenneson, and Martha Casanave.

November 17 Field Trip: Eastern State Penitentiary Bob Catlett



November and December Topic Definitions

All topic definitions for the entire club year can be found on page 15 of the SSCC *Member Handbook*, available in the Downloads section of *ssccbhotography.org*.

November: Open

Any subject matter, theme, and technique is acceptable, as long as the principal emphasis is on photography and shows the personal interpretation of the photographer.

December: Architecture

The center of interest has been designed and constructed or fashioned by humans. Architecture can include any building in its totality as well as any of its components, such as doors, windows, steel / concrete / timber frames, stairs, roofs, steeples, towers, domes, and the full gamut of architectural decoration. The term "architecture" includes the category "architecture without architects," in which people create habitats such as pueblos or underground dwellings. The term "architecture" also extends to works of civil engineering such as bridges, ancient arches/arenas/aqueducts / baths, dams, ship terminals, subway systems, etc.

Projected Image Entry Guidelines

JPG File Format, 1024 pixels wide (MAX) by 768 pixels tall (MAX), sRGB color space, 500 KB max size, correct file name format.

File Name: Class~Maker's Name~Image Title.jpg Example: Nov~Tom Jones~Good Friends.jpg The tilde ~ character separates 3 fields of the file name.

Class – Nov or Adv

Maker's Name – spaces allowed, use the same name throughout the year.

Image Title – spaces allowed, no commas.


