Travel Photography is composed of many different disciplines or types of photography.

- Street – photo journalism

Shoot locally to practice. Look for local culture (HonFest), signage (Pennsylvania Ave), unique elements, (Times Square).

Photo Basics:

When travelling we are more aware of our surroundings than when we are at home. The goal of travel photography is to translate that heightened

awareness to a picture. This usually will help you get something no one else saw or a different perspective on the common scene. Be receptive and aware of different scenes, lighting and situations.

Equipment:

Camera, lenses, flash, tripod, bag, strap, cleaning kit, extra batteries, memory, battery charger, gloves, Ziploc bags. Smartphone, GPS, hat, backup harddrive

When you are there:

- Maps in Hotel Lobby
- Postcards
- Ask locals

Best practices while traveling:

- Keep camera out and ready
- Scout location if possible, pay attention to the light

- Walk around the scene looking for the best angle
- Keep records, receipts, guide maps, coasters, and business cards. All helps when creating a story later
- Use GPS app (Geotag Photos Pro) to log location or snap a picture with smart phone to record a location
- Backup photos to a laptop or a separate harddrive
- NEVER format memory cards while travelling, buy more!

Challenges of shooting on the go and equipment to solve problems

- Harsh lighting – variable ND, polarizer, fill flash
- Unknown exposure - Sunny 16 rule and shoot RAW
- Focus points - Autofocus modes, less red dots!
- Depth of field - AV mode
- Too many people – slow shutter speed, tripod, variable ND
- Rain, sand, ocean spray – plastic bag, waterproof housing
- Night – tripod, flash, flashlight
- No flash in museums – higher ISO, use an existing support
- Glasses – keep a copy of your prescription

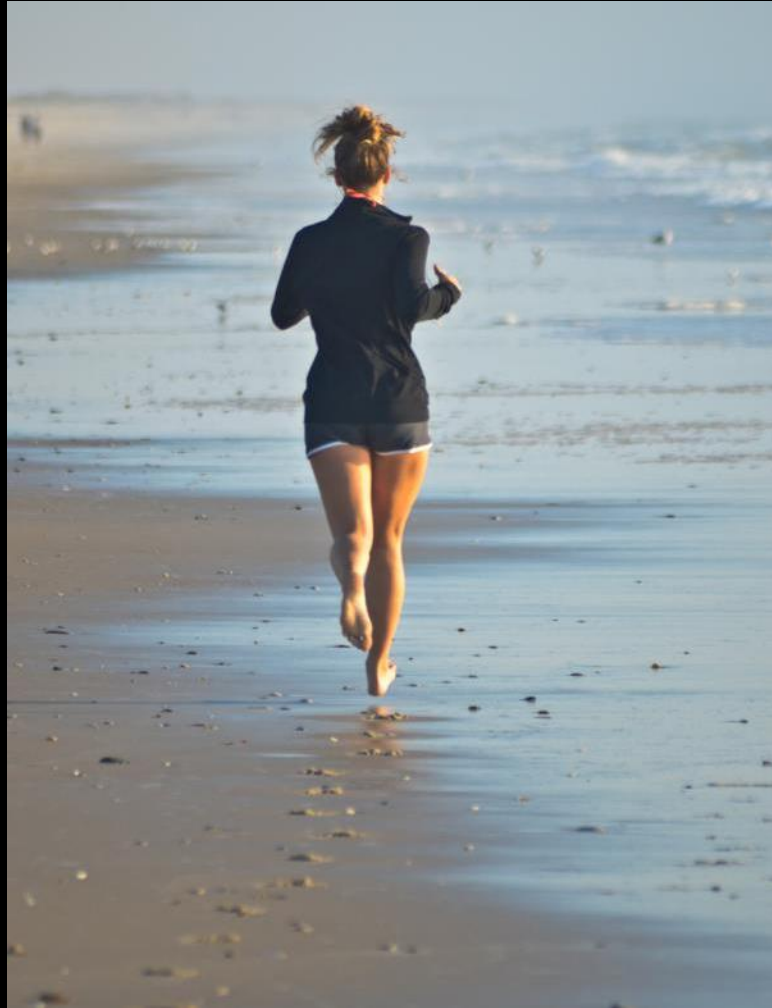

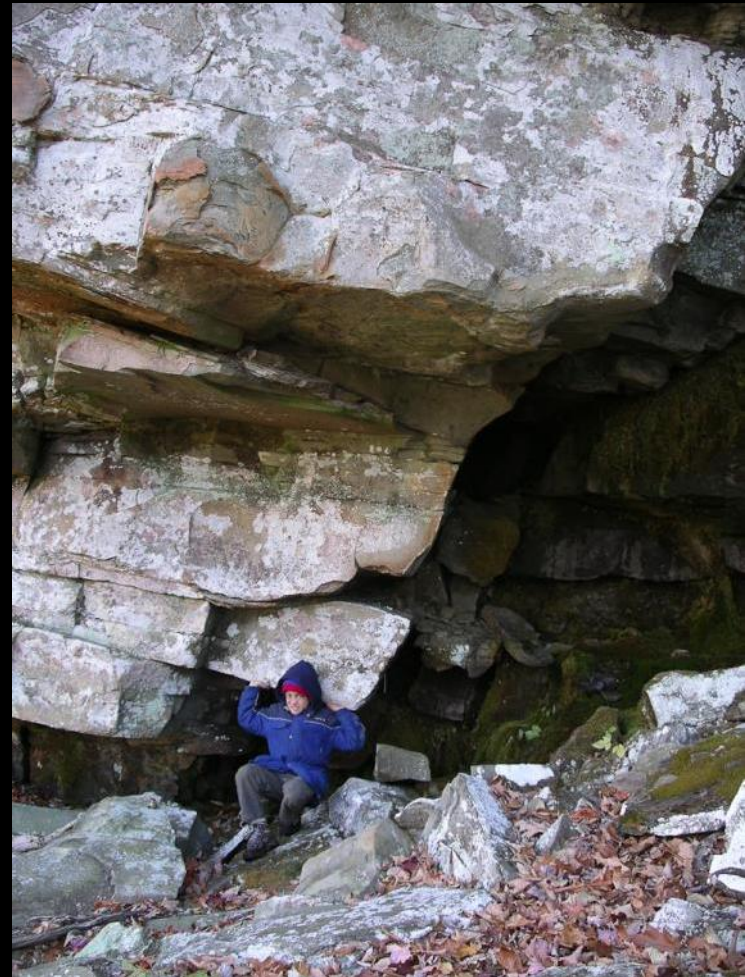
