The I.C.P.C. is a PSA- sponsored competition in which the Silver Spring Camera Club is entered this year.

There will be a total of five contests: October, December, February, April, and June, and a Print of the Year judging. Trophies will be awarded the winning clubs and the winning individuals in the Print of the Year contest.

For each contest SSCC must submit 4 prints by different makers. Prints must be mounted on 16x20 boards. Black and white program chairman Ira Penn will be in charge of sending our entries, which will be chosen from advanced class winners in monthly club competitions. If a member does not wish to have his prints entered in the I.C.P.C. he should notify Ira or George Winnett before the club judging so the judge can be asked to select alternate photographs.

This competition will give us a good opportunity to see how our best print-makers stack up against others around the country, and to earn some recognition for the club.

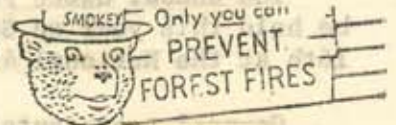
