All entries should be turned in to him at the November 6 meeting, but Ira will accept prints and slides at his home through November 9 (call first) from those unable to meet the November 6 deadline. Entry fees are \$1.00 for each class and must be paid at the time entries are submitted.

This year the program will be run somewhat differently. The black and white portion will be held in the morning. During the luncheon following the print judging Dr. Ernest Buccero will speak. Awards will be distributed to winners immediately after the competition. Cost of the cafeteria-style luncheon is \$1.50 per person.

All entries must be submitted through an affiliated camera club, and contestants must be members in good standing in their clubs. So -- pay your dues!

The annual All-Maryland Individual Photo Contest will be held at 10:00 a.m. on November 2 at the C & P Pioneer House, 5407 Harford Rd., Baltimore (near Camera Mart). Entries may be turned in to President Irene Weidler, 2112 Ross Rd., Silver Spring, up to October 31.

The competition is open to SSCC members in good standing. There is a fee of \$1.00 for each category: Black and White Prints; Color Prints; Slides. Four entries per category may be submitted. Competition will be judged in three classes for Black and White Prints: Amateur (novice), max. 8 x 10; Advanced amateur, max. 11 x 14; Unlimited, max. 16 x 20.

Color prints will be judged in two classes: Amateur (novice), max. 11 x 14; Unlimited, max. 16 x 20.

There are no classes for color slides (mas. 2½ x 2½). All will be judged together. Generally speaking, you compete in the class in which you compete in SSCC, in the print categories.

You must complete an entry form and make out the All-Maryland labels required for prints. These may be obtained from Irene meidler. Entries will be returned at the November 6 color meeting, in time for submission in the GWCCC contest.
