At the opposite end of the spectrum are Henri Cartier-Bresson and Edward Weston, who felt that a photograph should be printed as taken without manipulation of any kind.

At the December 18 black and white meeting top print makers in our own club noted for that elusive something called "print quality" will explain how they achieve it. This should be a technical presentation of the first rank.

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The color workshop for December 4 will complete the series of three given by Bernard Blass on the subject of Kodacolor.
