DECEMBER MEETINGS

The speaker at the December 4 color meeting will be Mr. S. Franklin Gould, APSA, ANC, a national lecturer for PSA since 1965, with a talk entitled "One Plus One Equals One, or, Scenic and Creative Montages Simplified." In it he will discuss every type of montage, from background montaging to abstracts. Mr. Gould's approach to photography in this regard is reminiscent of that of pictorial photographer H. P. Robinson, who was famous as a creator of composite black and white photographs in an earlier day. At the opposite end of the spectrum are Henri Cartier-Bresson and Edward Weston, who felt that a photograph should be printed as taken without manipulation of any kind.

At the December 18 black and white meeting top print makers in our own club noted for that elusive something called "print quality" will explain how they achieve it. This should be a technical presentation of the first rank.

The color workshop for December 4 will complete the series of three given by Bernard Blass on the subject of Kodacolor.

Workshops should be short, no longer than 15 minutes, and should, if possible, incorporate illustrative material. No technical idea is valid unless it results in a better slide or print.
