DARKROOM TECHNIQUE

VERSATILE VERSATOL

Apartment-dwelling camera enthusiasts are often plagued by lack of space and difficulty in storing darkroom chemicals. A handy all-purpose developer little known to 35 mm. workers is Kodak's Versatol.

Diluted 15:1 for film, this useful, one-shot developer works rapidly without producing excessive grain and does a splendid job of print-making. It keeps well in the original bottle after opening. Prize-winning prints in club competition have been produced with this compromise developer.
