Each member may submit FIVE monochrome prints and FIVE color slides. All entries must have been entered in monthly club competitions or in G CCC or All-Maryland competitions during this club year (from September, 1969). They need not have won awards, but their category (novice or advanced) must be indicated.

A member may enter prints and slides even though he is unable to attend the banquet. Awards will be given for first, second, and third place, together with seven honorable mentions, to winners in each of the four divisions: novice and advanced, color slides and monochrome prints.
