## OCTOBER MEETINGS

At the COLOR SLIDE meeting we will be treated to two successful photo essays by the team of Charles and Diane Keaton, active PSA photographers recently moved to the Washington area from St. Louis, where they were leaders in the St. Louis

Camera Club. The two 30-minute documentary shows are "The World of the Navajo" and "Temple Square," which concerns the Mormons. Charles and Diane, now members of our Club, will describe the projection equipment they use and some lessons they learned about putting shows together.

At the BLACK AND WHITE PRINT meeting, Marion E. Warren will present "People in Pictures." Mr. Warren is an Annapolis photographer whose picture publication Annapolis Adventure was just released. His book contains photographs of every aspect of the Maryland capitol city. Mr. Warren's photography is widely known. This is due, in part, to publication of his work in the Maryland Magazine. Mrs. Warren, whose captions document her husband's new book, will accompany him.

Morris Weinberger will present a Short-Short entitled "The Story Behind the Picture."

GWCCC is considering the addition of a new category. This would be in the form of a photo print essay consisting of two or more prints mounted on a maximum of three 16 x 20" mat boards joined together. These boards would be filled with as many prints (exceeding 1) as the entrant cared to place on them. No script or written story would be permitted. However, an appropriate subject title would be encouraged. Although no limitation has been decided upon, prints may be limited to black and white.

"... When you are producing good photographs deliberately and not just by chance there is no likelihood of your being bored or feeling that life is empty. Rather you will feel that you do not have enough time in which to photograph all the things worth photographing - the smile of an innocent child, the playfulness of a young animal, the activities of Nature. With this, of course, goes the developing of your own film and the enlarging, without which it is not complete photography. This is creative work, for which a craft must be learned and mastered, but, that done, there is a real art to be practised. When it reaches this stage photography becomes really satisfying and provides a new dimension to your creativeness and so makes you happy."
