On Sat., Feb. 27, the GWCCC will sponsor a course in Creative Color Photography to be presented by John Doscher of S. Woodstock, Vt. The group will make the Hotel Bossert

Mr. Doscher is widely known as one of the foremost teachers of photography in the U.S. He operates a year-round school in color slide and black and white photography. With his great sense of humor, Mr. Doscher's toaching is entertaining as well as instructive.

The course will consist of 3 lectures of 2½ hrs. each. It will be given at the Mational Presbyterian Church & Center, 4101 Nobraska Ave., N.W. JIM WARNER COMPETITION TO BE HOSTED BY ALL-MARYLAND CCC

All-Md. CCC is hosting a photographic competition sponsored by Jim Warner. Purpose of contest is to obtain good photographs which Jim Warner can have reproduced to sell throughout the country for home decor ation. Monochrome and color prints & color slides are eligible to be entered by members of Council affiliated camera clubs. Trophies & ribbons will be awarded. The winners will be reviewed for salability. Several or all of the 10 winners in each category will be selected and makers of those selected will be given contracts which will provide reyalty of 5¢ per reproduction of their print or slide sold by Jim Warner, with a minimum guarantee of \$75 representing the first 1500 copies. Reproduction rights of those selected will Rolleiflex, 1951 model, 75 mm f.35 Tesar be kept by Jim Marner for 3 years. All publicity & distribution of reproductions will be handled by Jim Warner.

The responsibility of the Council will be to collect all prints & slides, conduct the contest judging, & return non-winning prints to the makers. Entry fee will be \$1 per entrant for up to 6 prints or slides. This fee will go to the Council.

ABOUT JOHN W. DOSCHER . . .

A VERSATILE PHOTOGRAPHER

John W. Doscher, a Fellow of the Photographic Society of America and a Fellow of the Royal Photographic Society, is a versatile photographer whose work is widely known. His photography, in both monochrome and color, ranges from pictorial landscapes and night scenes, product illustration and advertising pictures, to portraiture. He is the holder of an all-time world's record in exhibiting and has received the Philadelphia Art Directors Award for outstanding work in color photography.

AN ACCOMPLISHED TEACHER

Approximately 30,000 people from all 50 states, Canada and 26 foreign countries have attended classes by John Doscher—either at his Country School of Photography or in short courses that he popularized more than 15 years ago in various cities throughout the United States and Canada. He has taught courses at many colleges and universities and is regarded as a facile critic of the photographic medium.

A VIVID PERSONALITY

Most of his students regard John Doscher as a personal friend. His correspondence is voluminous and everyone writes to "Father John" about photographic problems. A tribute to the man and his school is the annual Winter Reunion in Woodstock, Vermont that brings alumni from more than 20 states and parts of Canada to renew friendships and have an opportunity to again talk with "Father John."
