**CALCULATING EXPOSURE**

A convenient way of determining correct exposure when caught without a meter is to translate the ASA film speed directly into a shutter speed and standard f stop. For example, an ASA of 400 can be translated into 1/400th of a second at f 16 in bright sunlight. Similarly, an ASA of 50 can be translated into 1/50th of a second at f 16 in bright sunlight. The standard f stop is f 16. The standard condition is bright sunlight. In the absence of bright sunlight, one can extrapolate to meet different conditions. On a cloudy day 1/50th of a second at f 8 might be used.
