CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS PROPOSED

Two constitutional amendments were put forth at our January 18th meeting to be voted on at the meeting on February 15th. The amendments both deal with SSCC finances and are reproduced below. In order to amend the Constitution we need a 2/3 vote of the membership. Since this is relatively impossible to get at a regular meeting by hand vote, we will use the following procedure. A ballot for your vote will be found on the last page of this Cable Release. Fill out the ballot and either mail it to the SSCC P. O. address or turn it in to Ira Penn at the meeting on Feb. 1st or 15th. Immediately following our meeting on February 15th there will be a short discussion period held for any interested parties to talk about the matter. After the discussion all remaining ballots will be collected. All persons not submitting a ballot will be presumed to be transferring their vote to the Executive Board (in other words a proxy) which will count ballots at the Executive Board meeting on March 8th. Your Executive Board recommends a vote FOR both amendments. Please address all questions to Ira A. Penn.

OLD AMENDMENT-Article 11-Dues and Assessments-Section 1

Dues shall be \$7.50 per year per member or family of husband and wife. Dues are payable for the year and due the first meeting in September. New members joining February 1 or later shall pay dues of \$4.00 for the remainder of the club year. Dues for high school students and full time undergraduate college students will be \$5.00 per year.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT to Article 11, Section 1

Dues shall be \$9.00 per year per member or family of husband and wife. Dues are payable for the year at the first meeting in September. New members joining after February 1st or later shall pay dues of \$5.00 for the remainder of the club year. Dues for high school students and full-time undergraduate college students will be \$6.00 per year or \$3.00 per year for those joining after February 1st.

OLD AMENDMENT-Article 12, Section 2, Paragraph C-Finance Committee

The Treasurer is Chairman of the committee. This committee shall prepare a proposed budget to be submitted to the President prior to the September meeting. This committee shall cause an audit of the Treasurers books of account to be made twice a year and presented for the approval of the President.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT to Article 12, Section 2, Paragraph C

Finance Committee. The Treasurer shall be Chairman of the Committee which shall consist also of the Vice-President, the Director serving the second year of his term, and the Librarian. This Committee shall prepare a proposed budget to be submitted to the President prior to the September meeting. This committee shall cause an audit of the Treasurer's books of account to be made twice a year and presented for the approval of the President. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer and the Finance Committee to oversee all expenditures (Con't, Page 3)

from the President

After much discussion and debate (which is a suphemism for screaming and yelling) among the members of the Executive Board we are proposing two constitutional amendments which you will find printed on page one of this Cable Release. I would like to use my column this month to explain these amendments.

The amendment dealing with the Finance Committee serves two purposes. First, it spells out exactly who serves on the committee and what its role is, and second, it establishes a firm budgeting requirement for the Club. As I mentioned in my first Candid Shots article in September, we are a growing organization. We are too big to be running day-to-day by "the seat of our pants". Our Finance Committees have heretofore consisted of the Treasurer and our budgets have been, for all practical purposes, non-existant. It is necessary that this lax method of operation cease. We have already established a budget and a Finance Committee for this year. I would hope it would be continued in the future.

The other amendment is certainly self-explanatory. We are asking for an increase in the dues. Whatever else you may think of the idea, please don't think it was arrived at lightly. Much time was spent in deciding on the appropriate figure and all expenditures were justified. Our last dues increase was in 1966. The increase prior to that was in 1955. Raising dues is not one of our favorite passtimes! The proposed figures will allow us to operate comfortably - no fat - no starvation. There is no provision in our budget for a trip to Bermuda for the Executive Board. However, there is no reason why our Hostess should have to buy "last week's cookies" either! We have prepared a hypothetical budget for next year using the figures based on expenditures for the last three years. Don't take my word for it - come look at the figures!

We are now at the halfway point of our 1972-73 season. As I mentioned to the Executive Board only a few weeks ago, I'll soon have to appoint a Nominating Committee. I think our year so far has been a good one. We have been trying to build a better SSCC with expanded programs and activities for the members. Many of the things we are doing - such as community service, group purchasing, and color slide exhibiting, are new innovations this year. It takes time to get new programs started - especially if you want to do them right! I am proud of the enthusiasm and cooperative spirit that has been shown by both the Executive Board and the general membership this year. As always, I solicit your ideas and opinions - either in a Letter to the Editor, at an Executive Board meeting, or just in informal conversation.
