The Corcoran Gallery of Art will present the work of two young photographers, Emmet Gowin and Nancy Rexroth at a Members Preview Friday, September 14, 1973 from 9 to 11 p.m. The exhibition of 50 photographs will open to the public on Saturday, September 15 and continue through Sunday, October 14, 1973.

Many of Emmet Gowin's photographs are of family, friends and his wife, Edith. He says of his photographs, "My pictures are made as a part of everyday life and are not the result of any project or assignment." Life is breathed into the photographs, with the edges soft and round.

A native of Danville, Virginia, Emmet Gowin studied at the Rhode Island School of Design with Harry Callahan. His photographs have been included in many publications, and he has had numerous one man shows including one at the Museum of Modern Art.

Like Emmet Gowin, Nancy Rexroth grew up in Virginia and like him, she photographs everyday life, but her emphasis is on what the people inhabit rather than the people themselves. Her use of a DIANA camera, which costs 98¢, produces a fuzzy edge and focus that creates a space that one can flow through. Nancy feels that "I can inhabit and move through their atmosphere."

Nancy Rexroth studied at American University and received her MFA in photography from Ohio University. She is presently photographing southeastern Ohio as a result of a National Endowment grant. She has had many exhibitions, including one at the Baltimore Museum of Art and two at the Corcoran Gallery of Art.


