Categories are Monochrome Prints, Color Prints, and Color Slides. Cost is \$1.00 per category. Limit is 4 entries per category. Classes are Unlimited (SSCC-Advanced), Advanced (applicable to B&W prints only--open to SSCC advanced), Novice (SSCC Novice). You may not enter in a class lower than what you compete in in SSCC. Once you enter in a class vou may not enter in a lower class. If you win a "first" in a class, you must move up to the next higher class.

Prints must have All-Md label on back; sizes-Unlimited - maximum is 16 X 20; B&W Adv maximum is 11X14; B&W Novice - maximum is 8x10;
Color Novice - maximum is 11X14. Any print
may be mounted on a board up to 16X20.

Slides must be thumb spotted on lower left as correctly viewed and must be marked with name, title, club and class.
