A representative of the company will put on a display showing all steps in the exposure and development of a color print. It is expected that he will also demonstrate the making of a color print directly from a color slide. Interested members of the club and friends are invited to this workshop.

ALL MARYLAND INDIVIDUAL CONTEST

The Maryland Council of Camera Clubs will hold its fall contest on Sunday, November 18, 1973, 10 AM to 3 PM, at 5407 Harford Rd., Baltimore, Md. To be eligible, ALL ENTRIES MUST BE TURNED IN AT SSSCC's NOVEMBER 1ST MEETING to ALL-MD. Rep, Mike Stein.

Categories are Monochrome Prints, Color Prints, and Color Slides. Cost is \$1.00 per category. Limit is 4 entries per category. Classes are Unlimited (SSCC-Advanced), Advanced (applicable to B&W prints only--open to SSCC advanced), Novice (SSCC Novice). You may not enter in a class lower than what you compete in in SSCC. Once you enter in a class you may not enter in a lower class. If you win a "first" in a class, you must move up to the next higher class.

Prints must have All-Md label on back; sizes-- Unlimited - maximum is 16 X 20; B&W Adv - maximum is 11X14; B&W Novice - maximum is 8x10; Color Novice - maximum is 11X14. Any print may be mounted on a board up to 16X20.

Slides must be thumb spotted on lower left as correctly viewed and must be marked with name, title, club and class.
