Categories are Monochrome Prints, Color Prints, and Color Slides. Costs are paid by SSCC. Limit is 3 entries per category per person (You may submit up to 5 per category for SSCC committee selection.)

Classes are Unlimited (SSCC-Advanced), Advanced (applicable to B&W prints only--open to SSCC Advanced), Novice SSCC-Novice). You may not enter in a class lower than what you compete in in SSCC. Once you enter in a class you may not enter in a lower class. If you win a "first" in a class, you must move up to the next higher class.

Prints must have All-Md label on back. Sizes---Unlimited-maximum is 16x20; B&W Advanced-maximum is 11x14; B&W Novice-maximum is 8x10; Color Novice-maximum is 11x14. Any print may be mounted on a board up to 16x20. Slides must thumb spotted on lower left as correctly viewed and must be marked with name, title, club and class.

Any entry which has been entered in a previous All-Md contest and won a 1st, 2nd or 3rd (except in the Fall 1973 Contest) or has been entered in more than one prior All-Md contest may not be re-entered. Print entrants should be aware that if they win a ribbon (place or HM), their prints will be held for exhibition. All other entries will be returned at SSCC's March 21st meeting.
