STOCK PHOTO AGENCY

Photo Research International (Photri) is a photo agency with clients in 25 countries and the United States. To meet the needs of publishers, educators, advertisers, and other clients for photographs and film strips, Photri maintains a huge stock file of carefully indexed and cross-referenced color slides and black-and-white prints on a variety of subjects that cover virtually the entire human experience - from agriculture and art to transportation and weather.

Photri will accept any number of color slides and 8 x 10 glossy black-and-white prints for their stock file from photographers who will leave their photos on file for at least two or three years. When the photo is sold, the photographer gets 50% of the fee. Typical fees range from \$25-35 for a B&W print up to \$35 for a color slide, with photos of special interest bringing \$150-200. Super situations and photos for large advertisers might be worth up to \$1500 on special assignments.
