Norman Rothschild is widely known for his experiments in the use of color materials to achieve unusual and creative effects. He has been described as "the world's most enthusiastic amateur".

Mr. Rothschild's active interest in photography begain during his Boy Scout days. At age 18, he started to freelance and during World War II, he served as a Signal Corps photographer. He has been writing about photography since 1952. His monthly feature, "Offbeat", has appeared in Popular Photography for the past 15 years.

In addition to his activities as a writer, lecturer, and technical consultant, he has authored 3 books and currently teaches at New York University and the Camera Club of New York. Mr. Rothschild will share his creative ideas and techniques with us via a slide presentation. Come early and assure yourself a seat!
