

Fullers had their own gallery where they featured works of local origin, as well as out-of-town photographers from around the nation and the world. SPOTTING PRINTS IS AN ART, BUT EASY

If you work with 35mm or 120/220 negatives, the chances are that nearly all prints you produce will have need of some spotting. If you are producing large prints for exhibition, the art of spotting is a necessary part of your photographic knowledge and practice.

Most serious amateurs prefer the dye type like SPOTONE, which comes in a series of bottles with directions for mixing to match various paper emulsions.

You must learn to match the density of your print with the density of your spotting material, which is reduced from black to various shades of gray by the addition of water.

Use a white saucer or a white piece of formica as a palette, placing a few drops of spotting dye in one corner and a few drops of water in another. Have a couple of camel's hair brushes, either size 000 or 00, and start by dipping your brush in water and then in the dye until you get the shade of gray you are after.

Since the dye is permanent in the emulsion, it is best to start with a shade lighter than the print area to be spotted and gradually darken your spotting material as necessary.

Don't make the mistake of applying the spotting dye as you might a water color. Use a nearly dry brush and apply the spotting material a little at a time.

You first dip your brush in the dye, then wipe the brush in a circular motion to remove the excess moisture. This also leaves your brush with a fine point.

Now, attack the spot with the tip of your pointed brush in small, short strokes, or jabs. Be patient, for after a few brush strokes, you will see the spot begin to disappear.

Don't overdo your spotting. Practice on an old print until you train your eye to match the tones in the area to be spotted. Remember to use a dry brush.

One final tip. You need a good light, a strong directional light that can be focused on the print. You will be able to see more clearly what you are doing.



KEEP YOUR LENS CLEAN

Kodak says that unclean lenses is one of the causes of unsharp pictures. Fingerprints and dust on your lenses interfere with optical clarity the same way they would if your glasses were dirty.

When cleaning lenses remember they are soft. First blow off all the dust and grit. Use Kodak lens cleaning paper moistened with Kodak Lens Cleaner. NEVER USE CHEMICALLY TREATED EYEGLASS TISSUES. They can damage your coated lenses.
