

TO ALL NOVICE PRINTERS ...

Recently I have been in the process of creating my first darkroom in my kitchen. As with all new pursuits, I have made my share of mistakes. bought the wrong size packages of chemicals, the wrong sized trays, some useless gadgets that a local photo supply store (that will remain nameless) told me were "indispensable", etc. Now, don't misunderstand, I approached the whole project with some intelligence. I consulted a clu member or two. I wrote down there advice and listened attentively. But, I did not always remember or heed their advice, especially while under the influence of a saleman in the nameless photo store. Of course I paid for this, but I have also learned from my mistakes.

The mistakes did not end with my purchases of equipment. I have also tried to develop prints in full strength Dektol (the result was loss of contrast and inability to develop beyond a pale gray). I forgot to dust my negatives. I threw away my diluted Dektol after only one use, and tried in vain to stir away all of those brown flecks that appeared after several prints. I also exposed Ilfospeed upside down, not once. It all

would have been worse had it not been for those patient club members who were willing to coach me over the phone. And so now I am slowly beginning to crank out some passable prints for competition and have become a certified darkroom addict. Thanks Skip, et al.

To all of you fledgling printers, the point of this dissertation is that the Club has many skilled photographers who are willing to assist you with darkroom or any photographic problems. Start by calling any of the Club officers and committee chairmen. Good luck!

THOUGHTS...

Some random quotes from The Perfect Photograph, Andreas Feininger, (Amphoto, 1974):

"...one of the most basic concepts in photography is the fact that any photograph represents a synthesis of technique and art...A photograph can be good only if it satisfies both artistic and phototechnical demands...in photography, technique is nothing unless complimented by art...This duality, of course, is inherent in any field of creative expression. It manifests itself at two levels: the level of creation, the level of execution...

"A photograph can be good only if it fulfills its purpose....The more precisely defined the purpose and message of a contemplated picture, the better its chance for success...

"Don't judge a photograph until you are sure you understand what the photographer wanted to say. Otherwise, you may be unfair to the photograph, the photographer, and last but not least yourself, because you might miss somthing that could have enriched your life if only you had understood."

This is definitely not a technical manual, nor is it a book on composition per se. But what Feininger has done well is to stimulate the process of photographic seeing and the psychology of successful photography. The book is well written, but sadly, with few exceptions, I can't say too much for the accompanying photos.
