THE ANNUAL CLUB AUCTION

This year's auction will be held on January 4, 1979, at the Color Slide Meeting. There will not be a speaker that night, but there will be a competition (open). So, start digging out anything that you think someone else might want, and start deciding on prices.

Although non-members are welcome to buy, only SSCC members can offer items for sale. The club will collect 10% of the proceeds from each sale, with the minimum commission being 50¢ and the maximum being \$10.00. That is, if your item sells for 60¢, you keep 10¢, and the Club keeps 50¢. If an item sells for over \$100.00, the Club's commission remains at \$10.00. If you have a number of small items, you may package them to sell as a group, or place them on a special table where they will be sold to the first buyer on a fixed price basis, with the entire proceeds going to the club. You may indicate that more than 10% (or all) proceeds go to the club.

Please mark items clearly with your name, any needed description of the item, and a minimum bid price (if any). Finally, the auction is not limited to equipment. You may also offer photographic services or prints for sale.

We are pleased that Len Tuchin has agreed to serve as our auctioneer again this year.

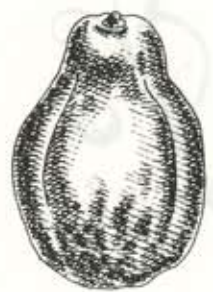

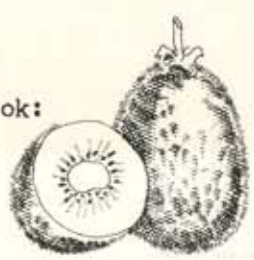

Remember:

- *there are no entry fees for individuals,
- *you can enter a maximum of 3 slides, 3 mono prints, 3 color prints,
- *there are no subject categories,
- *classes are novice & unlimited slides, novice (8x10 max) & advanced [intermediate] (11x14 max) unlimited (16x20 max) mono prints, novice (11x14 max) & unlimited (16x20 max) color.

Since this is the annual "club" contest, individuals and clubs can win ribbons/trophies. Each club has a limit of 20 entries in a class --there is no way SSCC can do well *as a club if we don't enter our full quota. If we get more than 20 submissions in a class, there will be a SSCC pre-judging to narrow down to the limit of 20.
