

MONOCHROME PRINT WORKSHOP SET FOR BIG YEAR

Two Pronged Program Will Tackle The Task Of Improving Our Photographic Expertise In All Aspects

System Photography, The Painless Way to Better Prints Print Critique Gets Everyone Into The Act

Print quality may not be the most important factor in the success of a photograph but it certainly is a neccessary factor in that any less than the best quality will detract from whatever else the photograph has to offer.

This portion of the workshop is aimed at encouraging growth in the technical capabilities of the membership through sharing of expertise and by researching new areas.

Specific areas for discussion will include exposure, development and printing controls; exposure meters; zones; flare; fog; standards and many other subjects. A number of exercises will be described to illustrate the concepts discussed in the workshop.

Technical quality in a photograph is very much like language. It is neccessary to speak the language in order to convey your message. Having learned to speak, we must have something to say. In photography, we say the image we portray.

This portion of the workshop will be devoted to developing a concensus on and an understanding of the concepts of high quality photography

The aspects of image quality and trends in photography will be topics for discussion. Open critique will be undertaken to examine all aspects of the work of professional photographers Critique of our own work will be undertaken in three ways to get the broadest possible view of what's good and what's not.
