OCTOBER 16 7:45pm NOTHWOOD HIGH SCHOOL COMPETITION: OPEN

Betty Ford and Judy Burr of the North Bethesda Camera Club will honor the SSCC with an informative child photography presentation at the October print meeting. Burr, the present president of the NBCC and Betty Ford, a former president and current vice president and bulletin editor of the the club are both amateur photographers who have developed a successful business in candid child photography. Their talk will focus on their techniques in shooting and marketing their photos. Ford has been active in photography for over ten years, and was a free-lancer for two years. She has had her work published in the 'Washington'an". "Maryland", the "Washington Dossier", as well as numerous educational magazines. Burr has a lifelong interest in photogaphy and has taken courses at Montgomery College and at the Vashington School of Photojournalism. She has also had numerous photos published by the United Methodist Publishing House.

A MAIL ORDER EXPERIENCE or BUYER BEWARE

Since many of <u>The Cable Release'</u> readers either are or potentially are customers of Porter's Camera Store, Cedar Falls, Iowa, I thought that I would relate a recent mail order experience with that firm.

Porter's frequently offers discontinued, clearance and other merchandise at special, low, prices. These are publicized through mailings to people on their mailing list. These items are usually a very good deal for the photographer who has use for the item. HOWEVER, there is a pitfall in placing these orders, as I learned the hard way.

Since Porter's has a minimum shipping, handling and "assured delivery" charge of \$2.00, and since clearance items are of limited supply, it is possible to receive one or two small, inexpensive items and pay a rather high price because of this charge. Thus, I ordered several items including two rolls of B/W film. However, all the items had been sold out except for the two rolls of Agfapan, which were priced reasonably at \$1.95 each. When I received my "order", consisting of the two rolls of film, I found that I had been charged 2 X \$1.95 plus \$2.00 shipping, etc. In other words, I ended up paying a dollar more per roll of film.

In my opinion, part of the reason for this exorbitant charge is Porter's policy of enclosing a copy of their thick, heavy, tabloid style catalog with every order (even if you tell them you don't want one because you already have several). In fact, the first class mailing cost for the two rolls of Agfapan should have been less than \$.60.

When I spoke with Dew Hansen, Porter's consumer assistance representative, I was informed that the shipping, etc. charge was their policy and that their shipping department had determined that the two rolls of film were adequate justification for filling my order. In filling previous orders, I had -

on occasion - been advised, in advance of shipping, that some of the order could not be delivered and I had been given the option of cancelling or reordering, or proceeding with the partial order. I was not given that choice in this case. It is true, however, that Porter's makes the existence of this charge clear.

Therefore, before you place an order from Porter's (or any other firm's) clearance merchandise, beware that you may receive only part of your request and pay a premium because of shipping, handling and "assured delivery" charges.



AN INVITATION TO EXPAND YOUR HORIZONS...

Garry Kreizman and Mike Stein have formed a new group within SSCC-the New Directions Workshop. They are excited about the prospects of a dynamic and active group, sharing new ideas and experiences, while providing a springboard for growth as individuals through new and innovative forms of photographic expression. SSCC members are urged and welcomed to become active particlepants in the New Directions Workshop.

The motivation behind the Workshop is not to denounce or subvert
SSCC's longstanding tradition of
intra- and interclub competitions,
but to recognize the limitations of
those competitions and provide an
alternative outlet for photographic
expression.

We have all learned from competitions, both technically and artistically. There reaches a point, however, where we frequently find ourselves putting aside what we really feel good about and substituting something aimed at what we think the judges want to see. The judges, especially in council competitions, wind up seeing replays of themes which have "worked" in the past -- a victous cycle. New Directions strives to end this inbreeding by removing the competition orientation, New Directions will have no competitions; it will provide an outlet for doing your own thing through exhibitions, within and without SSCC.

Competitions by their nature impose restrictions on submissions-technique, media, dimensions, etc.
New Directions imposes no such restrictions, save some kind of photorelated basis for a work, Normal
slides and prints are great, but we

also want to encourage photosilkscreen, photocollage, multidimensional "prints" or just about anything you can think of.

While we want to grow as individuals, we can't really grow in a vacuum. New Directions will meet monthly so that we can share our experiences -- technical and artistic, and so that we can share our successes and our failures, and so that we can both learn and teach.

Workshop meetings will basically consist of discussions centered around presentations by group members. Participants will also be encouraged to present and possibly discuss their photowork at regular Club meetings. In addition we are going to arrange special Workshop exhibits outside of the Club.

If this all sounds interesting, exciting, challenging, please let Mike (384-5427) or Garry (384-4911) know. We are planning to have the first New Directions meeting on Thursday, October 9 at 7:30pm at Mike Stein's. Call for directions.

In an effort to bring uniformity to SSCC exhibits, please observe the following guidelines when pre-

paring prints:

All prints submitted for SSCC exhibits must be mounted and/or matted with glass, in standard gallery frames. If anyone encounters difficulty in acquiring these frames, please call me. I will either tell you where to purchase them (at a 10% discount), or arrange for other club members to loan you frames for an exhibit.

Ohoice of mat color may be decided by individual photographers, and photographs may be double matted but they do not have to be.

Please place hangers on the sides of the frame pointing inward, or make some provision for attaching picture wire across the back of the frame.

Titles of prints and signatures may be on the mat, the print or the mount board. Prices, business cards, addresses, phone numbers and other information must be on the back of

the print.

There are no size restrictions (within reason), except that prints must be a minimum of 7"x9". A novice may submit prints larger than 8"x10", etc. Exhibit prints do not have to have been entered in the Club or Interclub competitions. Color prints do not have to be printed by the photographer as is required in Club Competitions.

If enough members are interested, I will have a matting and framing

workshop.

Any member of SSCC who is having his/her own show or is participating in a group show outside of SSCC may give me the information so that announcements can be published in the Cable Release. Other members want to see your work! will attempt to plan SSCC exhibits so that they do not conflict with individual exhibits, where possible.

Anyone having any questions; problems or suggestions should not hesitate to call me. Everyone is

encouraged to participate.
