Judging -- A Personal Gripe!

We often get the impression that we should be thankful to any outside speaker that does us the honor of judging our monthly competitions. We are too well aware that the judging process is highly personal and subjective --most of us have come to terms with the outspoken "I hate cats" attitudes.

But where do we draw the line? I think there is nothing wrong with expecting a judge to live up to or abide by some reasonable standards of performance. The fact that they are our guests does not give them freedom from common courtesy in giving fair consideration to our work. Is it asking to much for a judge to recognize that the ke was thought, effort and intent on the part of the maker of an entry? We accept the risk that a judge simply may not like a work, but he or she should at least look at it! I was appalled to see our February slide "guest" be so crude as to reject entries before they were even focused...was he even looking at the screen?

I'm ambivalent to the fact that this same judge insisted on a first place tie to the point that it's not exactly the end of the world. But, the fact remains that this is totally against our competition rules. It is the obligation of the SSCC program chairman running the competition to be courte ous but firm in explaining our customs and rules. This is the first time that I can remember where the judge was so cocksure that he knew how we did things better than we did to the point of arrogance. To be sure, other judges have been reluctant to conform, but have in the end conceded to the ways of the house they were a guest in.


