## The Zoom Lens As A Creative Tool

The Victor Hasselblad Company, in a recent issue of their newsletter, ran an article describing their 140-280mm Variogon Zoom Lens for use with Hasselblad cameras.

They've given permission for the following excerpt, which suggests that at least this notable camera manufacturer favors the Zoom as a useful addition to your photographic arsenal.

An obvious benefit of this Variogon is the "two lenses in one" For sports and action photography, you can zoom in for greater detail instantly. For portrait photographers the change from a head-and-shoulders to a three-quarter length portrait is as easy as moving the focusing ring.

Besides these applications for simplifying photography, the Variogon is also a tool for creating images that can only by made with a zoom lens. If you rotate the zoom ring while the shutter remains open, highlights become streaks radiating from the center of the picture.

You can vary the length of these streaks by changing the amount of "zooming". Going through the entire focal length range produces long streaks while shorter streaks are made by only using part of the range. Rapid zooming causes faint streaks, and slow zooming more pronounced ones.

If the focal length is being changed for the entire exposure time, the image will consist of only streaks. The subject itself is hardly visible, if distinguishable at all

A more effective zoom image is created when the subject can be recognized, surrounded by the streaks. To obtain this effect, keep the focal length constant at either the longest or shortest setting for about half the exposure time, then vary it for the rest of the fime.



Zooming from a shorter focal length to a longer one will generate streaks extending outward from the center. The streaks will converge towards the center by zooming from a longer to a shorter focal length.

Whichever effect you want, you can be sure that the Variogon will produce the best results on your medium format Hasselblad.

Additionally, Hasselhlad has published a fine 28 page hooklet entitled "Black & White Photography" by Ansel Adams. This booklet is available free of charge upon request, and contains very excellent reproductions of some of Adams' best black and white works. Interested in a copy? Write to

LOOKING FOR IDFAS? SOMETHING TO DO ON A RAINY SUNDAY AFTERNOON?...

Here's a thought from one of our more successful members; take down your shower door, put it in front of your television set and shoot some photos.

Remember, focal plane shutters (as in most single lens reflex cameras) should be set at 1/8 second or SLOWER to avoid "scan" lines. Also, use your tripod.

Instead of the Novice Corner, this month's Cable Release offers an explanation of the two larger groups of which SSCC is a member. It is hoped that this will clarify the situation for our newer members who may be puzzled by talk of the All MD and the GWCCC.

As their names imply, i.e. ALL Maryland Council of Camera Clubs and Greater Washington Council of Camera Clubs, the two groups to which SSCC belongs are regional associations of local camera clubs.

The two organizations each hold two competitions annually. In the Fall, clubs are invited to have their respective memberships compete on an individual basis. Thus, each of you are invited to enter whatever YOU feel are your best works. While you win for yourself, you also represent the Silver Spring Camera Club, in a way. The Spring events are the annual Club Competitions. For these judgings, you are asked to submit your best works. SSCC then nominates a special, internal, panel to "prejudge" these submissions. From amongst them, the club must choose the 20 best in each category, which are then placed into competition with the 20 best of other participating clubs. If your works are "accepted" as club entries, you gain recognition and club points. If your work wins, we ALL win!



How to get there: (Easiest) Take I-695 (Balto Beltway) to exit 31, which is NORTH of the city. This is Harford Rd, although it may not be called such at the exit. Take exit towards Parkville (southbound). The Pioneer Center is approximately 23 miles South of the I-695 exit. OR, if you know your way around downtown Baltimore; coming from the South, e.g. Silver Spring, take any road that'll get you to Route 1 coming into Baltimore. Route 1 is "North Avenue", a West - East street, which crosses Harford Road downtown. Take Harford Road Northbound and keep driving!
