NOVICE CORNER

This month's column is about print mounting, as required for club competitions.

There are three major methods of print mounting: (1) use of a heat press and "dry mount tissue,"; (2) use of pressure sensitive adhesive sheets, and (3) use of adhesive aerosols.

The first method is the oldest and highly accepted, but because it requires cumbersome and expensive equipment it's unfeasible for most of us. However, it is highly permanent and the least likely to deteriorate prints. The second method uses very thin double sided adhesive sheets which only need mechanical pressure for bonding. Note that

some brands are stingy in size of sheets, requiring great precision in applying them to the back of prints. This method boasts the ability to reposition prints somewhat, and the lack of noxious fumes. The third method requires spraying print backs with an aerosol adhesive AFTER final print location has been carefully determined. While some sprays claim to allow some repositioning, it is generally inadvisable to try it unless you reposition quickly, carefully, or unless the print is window matted to hide the adhesive mess. Too, some sprays are lumpy or change the plastics of RC papers. However, it's the cheapest method and can be used without problems.

I use the third method, with Scotch brand Photo Mount Spray. While I have some concern over the fumes (I do the spraying in a place other than where I do the actual mounting, and I hold my breath while I spray) this system is suitable for my uses. I spray the print <u>lightly</u> once in each direction (top to bottom and left to right), then wait about 45 seconds for the adhesive to "set". This step is very important; without it the adhesive may "bleed" from under the print. I then CAREFULLY position the print using a Falcon Print Mounting Positioner, cover the print with clear, paper-thin, plastic, and I go back and forth over the print with a rubber roller -- starting from the middle and working toward the outside. In doing this, I apply as much pressure as I can. Once I learned the trick of waiting 45 seconds or so (a trick which can be gleaned from the product label) I had no problems using this method. Of course, my liver may never be the same, but you can live without 3/4 of your liver!.

Be careful which aerosol product you select. Even Scotch has more than one product for the purpose, and some may not be suitable for you. Don't be like me; READ THE LABEL. A product which says it is "positionable" for a relatively long time, say five minutes or more, may not be good for you unless you have some way of applying uniform weight to the print while the adhesive bonds

permanently. Other sprays require that you use pressure available only from specialized equipment like a vacuum mounting frame.

*The Falcon Print Mounting Positioner has to be one of the greatest inventions of all time (for me, anyway). It is a cleverly engineered "T" square which quickly, easily, and without calculations, enables you to center any size print on just about any size board, such that the print is appropriately above physical center (optical center is, for some reason unknown to me, above geometrical center).

It is inexpensive, and -- to me -- indispensible.
