Our guest speaker for this month's slide meeting will be Cynthia Foster, the founder of First Foto Bank of Washington, D.C. Her topic will be "Travel Photog-raphy - How To Go About It and How To Make It Pay." She will discuss the travel photographer's attitudes, techniques, and tips on how to make this endeavor more rewarding. As the operator of a stock photo agency, Miss Foster will be able to reveal some new facets of a subject on which we have heard others speak.

Cynthia Foster studied psychology and photography at California State, Hayward; University of California, Berkeley; and Laney College. She has traveled widely, including a year spent in Paris. (She speaks French -- but that will not be the tongue in which she addresses us.) She was a flight attendant and supervisor for United Air Lines, and it was during that period that she became interested in travel photography. She left United to become a free lance. Her assignments took her to Africa with the U.S. Agency for International Development and the United Nations. Returning to Washington after having spent 13 years in San Francisco, Denver, Paris, and Africa, she helped organize the International Photography Society, and earlier this year started First Foto Bank.

There is now a new, easy positive-to-positive print material called Agfachrome-Speed color print paper which needs only 1½ to 2 minutes processing time in the activator and a 5 minute wash, no temperature control (65-70°F). SSCC Star and Master of Photography Awards

All points earned are counted toward the award regardless of class or category.
50 points = 1 star (5 maximum = 250 points)
300 points = Master of Photography

SSCC Year End Individual Awards

- · Each member may enter a maximum of five entries per category.
- Entries must have been entered in SSCC monthly competition or must have been an SSCC entry in an inter-club competition during the current season.
- Awards in each class/category will be made as follows: 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 5 HM.

Photographer of the Year Award

- One award for each category/class, based on points earned during the year.
- If a member moves to a higher class during the year, all the points earned in a lower class will be counted as half.

Service Award

Awarded to the member who has done the most for the SSCC during the season. Determined by secret ballot of the Executive Board.

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
