Taylor Gregg will be our speaker and judge for the April meeting. His topic will be "What It's Like To Be a Victim of the Media--or Why Pictures Always Lie." He describes it as a discussion of photo-journalism and ethics based on the conflict between perception and reality. With a broad background in journalism, photography, and human affairs, Taylor Gregg is uniquely qualified to deal with these matters.

Mr. Gregg's career started as an American cultural affairs specialist in Japan. Later he was hired by the Japanese Government as a cultural affairs officer in the U.S., working with the Japanese Ambassador. He then moved on to become an assistant editor of a trade magazine; during this period he taught himself photography. Mr. Gregg next worked as a free lance for the Washington Post's Potomac Magazine, where he specialized in business photography. He also served for 7 years as editor of Construction (a trade magazine). Gregg came to National Geographic as a senior picture editor 9 years ago. Currently, he serves as illustrations editor and as Asia area specialist.

If you have any questions about photo ethics, business and industrial photography, architectural photography, or working as a free lance, this should be your opportunity to get an informed opinion.

Our speaker and judge for April's print meeting is John Nuhn of the National Wildlife Federation. Mr. Nuhn was born in Bethesda and started his lifelong interest in photography while attending elementary school there. He began photographing with a Brownie and graduated to a 35mm camera in high school, taking pictures for the yearbook.

Mr. Nuhn attended Marquette University in Milwaukee and graduated with a journalism degree. While in college he was photo editor for the college yearbook and also took pictures for the college newspaper. Free lance work, ranging from news photography to weddings, helped pay his college expenses. Although much of his early experience is in black-and-white photography, he has in recent years concentrated on color. His favorite subjects are nature and people.

After graduating from Marquette, John Nuhn served as a public affairs officer in the U.S. Navy, as an editor and sales person for a Wisconsin publishing firm, and then as photo editor of National Wildlife. In 1982 the editorial staff moved from Milwaukee to Washington, D.C. to join the rest of the organization's personnel. Mr. Nuhn's home is now in Arlington.

The subject of Mr. Nuhn's talk for the evening will be "Marketing Photographs."

Directions to the Park: Take the Beltway to the Pennsylvania Ave. South Exit (this is Route 4) and proceed for about 8 miles; then take Route 301 South and proceed about 1½ miles; turn left on Croom Station Road and left again at Croom Road (Md 382); proceed about 2 miles and then turn left on Croom Airport Road; follow the signs to Park entrance on left.

A photo may be entered only in the same category in which it competed during the year. If you were a Novice who graduated to the Advanced class during this season, you may enter either the Novice or Advanced class for the Year-End. You may not enter both!

There will be a 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and five honorable mention awards given in each class. All slides or prints must have been entered during the year in SSCC club competition or for SSCC in an interclub competition, or as an SSCC club member in the CMCC or GWCCC competitions.
