
Sligo Community Center October 7



#### ANNUAL PHOTO-GRAPHIC CONTEST

November 14th

Each year the Council of Maryland Camera Clubs conducts two All-Maryland competitions. Date and Place of Contest: Sunday, November 14, 1993 from 9:30 to 3 PM at the Pioneer Center in Baltimore, Md.

All entries must be logged in by CMCC club representative at a meeting in Baltimore on November 8. To allow time for preparation of entry forms and labels, the entries should be brought to the SSCC Slide meeting on Thursday. November 4, 1993. NO LAST minute entries will be accepted!!!

Entry Fee: Contestants pay \$2.50 for each category that they enter.

Number of Entries: A maximum of four entries in one class of the four categories noted below

Categories of Entries: MONO-CHROME PRINTS, COLOR PRINTS, COMMERCIAL COL-OR PRINTS and SLIDES.

Categories are divided into classes as follows:

#### 1. MONOCHROME PRINTS

a. NOVICE CLASS: Contestants must compete in SSCC contests in the Novice Class. The maximum print size for novice class is 8/10 for CMCC. Note; An SSCC novice contestant who

submits 11×14 print must enter the print in the CMCC Intermediate Class, and all other 8×10 prints submitted at that time by the contestant will also be judged in the CMCC Intermediate Class.

- b. INTERMEDIATE CLASS: Contestants in this class must be members of affiliated clubs who compete in Intermediate Class in their club contests. The maximum print size is 11×14. (This class is not represented in SSCC contests, but see note above.)
- c. UNLIMITED CLASS: Contestants must compete in SSCC Contests in the advanced class. The maximum print size is 16×20.
- 2. COLOR PRINTS: (must be made by the contestant!!!)
- a. NOVICE CLASS: Contestants must compete in SSCC contests in the Novice Class. Maximum print size is 11/14.
- b. UNLIMITED CLASS: Contestants must compete in SSCC contests in the Advanced Class. Maximum print size is 16/20.
- COMMERCIAL COLOR PRINTS: (must be made by someone other than the contestant

such as a commercial lab!!!)

a. UNLIMITED CLASS: Contestants must compete in SSCC contests in the Novice or

Advanced Class. Maximum print size is

16/20.

#### 3. SLIDES

- a. NOVICE CLASS: Contestants must be those who compete in the SSCC Novice Class.
- b. UNLIMITED CLASS: Contestants must be those who compete in the SSCC Advanced Class. Note; 2/2 slide mounts are the maximum size in both categories.

ELIGIBILITY of EN-TRIES: A specific print or slide may be entered in one Fall and one Spring contest only. Within the same category, a person may not compete in a lower class after once having competed in a higher class. Further, a person must move to a higher class in a category after winning a 1st or any combination of two 2nd's and 3rd place awards in a lower class.

MOUNTING OF PRINTS: Prints may be mounted on any size or shape of mount up to a maximum of 16×20. The mounting board must be of a nonabrasive material with no wall hanging or other fastening devices or exposed adhesive on it.

#### MARKING OF ENTRIES:

- 1. PRINTS: Each SSCC member submission, when delivered to the representative, must be clearly identified on back as to title, SSCC Class and maker. Please put "SSCC" on all your entries! Prints must not show names on front. Also indicate on the back of print which is the top.
- 2. SLIDES: All slides must bear the name of the maker, title of slide and SSCC Class. Please put "SSCC" on all your entries! In addition, each slide must have the lower left hand corner marked conspicuously so it can be seen easily when the slide is viewed in its normal position.

# Photographers: A Varied Breed

A continued analysis...

The teacher—has taken "formal" courses and has memorized every photo text ever written. Takes Ansel Adams word as gospel. Only shoots photos in accord with "THE rules." Must have a subject in the #1 position, preferably with an "S" curve leading to it. Frequently judges competitions. Judging is solely in accordance with "THE rules." Takes boring and inflexible photos which, sadly, win competitions judged by similarly rigid individuals.

The zoned out
photographer—has worshipped at
the feet of Adams, White and
Zakia. Previsualizes every photo
for at least an hour and a half.
Places Zone VIII on Zone VIII,
except in certain circumstances
when Zone VIII is placed +1 and
the film is developed -1 (or vice
versa) leading to a total of 356
seconds of dodging and burning
under the enlarger. Actually,
these photographers are too
important to do their own
darkroom work. For that, they
hire some unknown and unsung
hero who actually produces the
great work from over AND under
exposed and developed negatives.

The junker user—only buys equipment which is within two weeks of the end of its life expectancy. Gets the stuff real cheap, too! Is one of the best customers at the Silver Spring Camera Club's annual auction. Actually figures out how to use the equipment, even though the instruction manuals have long since turned to yellow/brown dust. Unfortunately, photos never come out because no one can be found to develop the original Ektachrome.

The junker photographer—is wont to wander in junk yards and around old buildings looking for shots which scream "history" and/or texture. Must get a tetanus shot at least every two months,

and has had to outrun junkyard dogs more than once. Actually gets some good photos, but how many old gas pumps can you stand?

The ribbon weenie— will do ANYTHING to win an intra or interclub ribbon! Has been known to shoot seven rolls of 36 exposures with the camera on a tripod in front of a set-up. Claims each exposure is a unique creation which can be entered into competition.

The statement maker—photos produced by this photographer must "say something" to the viewer. It may be in some strange language, but - by golly - they say something!

The technoid—has memorized all of Morgan and Morgan's publications, including quarterly updates. Can calculate hyperfocal distances without a calculator, pencil or paper! Actually understands modulation transfer graphs. Speaks in "nanometers" and degrees Kelvin. Majored in fractal geometry in elementary school.

The snob—only buys the "very best" equipment (meaning the most expensive). Has a Nikon 800,008. Might be able to take good photos if only the equipment wasn't so complicated. But, remember, it is the "very best."

The intellectual—goes to museums with nauseating frequency. Studies the works of all the "great masters." Compares them to each other, discusses them with other intellectuals. Has folios of works by the great masters on coffee tables, in powder rooms, in walk in closets. Probably has hopes of becoming a great master through intense study (or osmosis).

The anti-intellectual—finds little or no value in studying the blurred, muddy works of years gone by. Has trouble with authors who use words like "divagate" and "hermeneutics" in photo magazines. Can't understanding why people consider photographic works great when they are blurred, or have no subject whatsoever. Frequently complains about all sorts of things. Takes

#### THE GREATER WASHINGTON COUNCIL OF CAMERA CLUBS

#### COMPETITION RULES

Adopted July 11, 1983, Revised June 14, 1993

The GWCCC will conduct two competitions each year, one in the fall and one in the spring. Both will be individual competitions with additional recognition for the clubs whose members submit winning entries. The date, location, number of entries and entry fees will be determined by the GWCCC Executive Board; they will be announced no later than 75 days prior to the competition

Competitions will be held on the first Saturday in December and the first Saturday in May, or on a Saturday as near to those as practical.

All members of the Clubs associated with the Council are encouraged to enter the competition and to submit new material in each competition.

#### LENTRIES

- A. Entrants. Where competitions are separated into levels of proficiency, Classes shall be as follows:
  - Master. Anyone who has attained and demonstrated a high excellence in photography. Any entrant may elect the class, but the following must compete in the Master Class
    - A professional, defined as one who obtains 50% or more income from photography, and

#### A person with "three stars" in PSA

- Advanced. Anyone of moderate or high ability in photography. An entrant who has received four (4) first, second or third place awards in the Advanced Class of GWCCC competitions since and including 1983, must compete in Master Class.
- Novice, A beginner or anyone of limited experience in competition. An entrant who has received four (4) first, second or third place awards in the Novice Class of GWCCC Competitions since and including 1983 must compete in a higher class. NOTE A competitor may enter as a Novice in one category [i.e. black and white prints] and a Master in another category [i.e. color prints] however, all advanced/master slide entrants who commercially process prints may not compete in any lower class.

#### 4 Category:

- 5. Entries must be Monochrome Prints, Color Prints, Slides Stereo Slides, Medium Format, Films and Photo Essays.
- 6. Appropriate clubs or groups approved by Executive Board, shall act as agents of the Executive Board for conducting competition in Stereo Slides and Photo Essays. Entry to these competitions shall be open to all members of GWCCC affiliated clubs. Entry particulars shall be determined by the conducting organizations.
- Prints and slides may be commercially produced.
- Prints must be mounted and secured on all four corners of the mount. Mounts or mats may not exceed 16 X 20 inches. A mounted print may not have more than one layer of mat overlay.
- Framed prints are not eligible for competition.
- 10. Prints submitted in the Novice Class may not exceed 11 X 16 inches. Prints submitted in other classes may not exceed 16 X 20 inches.
- 11. A toned print may be entered in Monochrome categories only.
- 12. Tinted prints (hand coloring)may be entered in Color Print categories only.
- 13. Slides may be mounted in cardboard, plastic or glass mounts, provided that the mounted slide is thin enough to be used in a standard 80 slide capacity carousel tray.
- 14. All entries must be free of harmful substances [eg,velcro, glue] that may cause harm to other entries. Entries will be disqualified from competition if they can cause any harm. No entry fee will be returned if work is disqualified.

#### B. Subjects.

- Pictorial. Open. Any subject, especially subjects that do not qualify in other subject definitions. NO image will be excluded from this category.
- Nature. Pictures that portray different kinds of various aspects of natural plant and animal life in a living state, that illustrates the natural features of land and sea or that reveal certain natural pheno ena, such as cloud formations, light refractions (sunsets auroras etc.), precipitation, frost, fire, but which do not show the hand of man, such as buildings, fences, beer cans etc. Domestic plants or animals may be included provided they do not show the hand of man.
- 3. Portraiture People or animals, full-length or close-up, including nudes and groups where the subjects rather than the activity are the main interest.
- Photojournalism. Storytelling pictures or people doing things where the activity itself is the theme
- Abstract. Blends of color, texture, shape, form and light to create a design-patterned image.
- Experimental. Images that utilize camera and or darkroom manipulations to achieve unreality.
- Architectural. Buildings, interiors, ruins, bridges or anything where man-made structures are the principle interest.
- Close-up. Images that result from the use of close-up lenses, macro lenses, etc., where the magnification of the subject exceeds that ob-

9. Still Life. Images of inanimate subjects in a static state.

#### C. Other Conditions

- An entry, whether it receives an award or not, may be entered only twice in any GWCCC competition, regardless of class or category.
- A competition entry which received a first, second, or third place or honorable mention award, or an entry of essentially the same image or the same type, may be entered only in a higher class.
- The entrant's Class in GWCCC competition shall be independent of the entrant's level of proficiency within the entrant's club.
- Each Club and the Club's delegate shall be responsible for administering the competition rules with regard to entries by Club members.

#### II. COMPETITIONS

- A. Both Slide and Print competition shall be conducted as follows:
  - I. Fall
    - a. Pictorial: Novice, Advanced and Master classes.
    - b. Nature: Novice, Advanced and Master classes.
    - c. Photojournalism: Novice, Advanced and Master classes.
    - d. <u>Abstract:</u> Novice and combined Master/Advanced classes.
    - e. <u>Close-up</u>: Novice and combined Master/Advanced classes.
    - f. Portraiture: Novice and combined Master/Advanced classes

#### 2. Spring

- a. Pictorial: Novice, Advanced and Master classes.
- Nature: Novice, Advanced and Master classes.
- Photojournalism: Novice and combined Master/Advanced classes.
- d. <u>Architectural</u>: Novice and combined Master/Advanced classes.
- e. <u>Experimental</u>: Novice and combined Master/Advanced classes.
- f. Still Life: Novice and combined Master/Advanced classes.

#### B. Participation

- <u>Eligibility</u>. Competition is open to all members of affiliated Clubs in good standing in the GWCCC.
- Good Standing. The standing of an affiliated Club shall be determined by the following:
  - <u>Dues</u>. Payment of dues by the deadline for submission of competition entries.
  - Roster. Submission of a complete Entrant Roster, including the GWCCC competition Class of each competition entrant, by the deadline for submission of competition entries.
  - Fees. Payment of all entry fees by the deadline for submission of competition entries.
  - Support. A reasonable record of support of all activities of the GWCCC. Determination regarding this requirement are reserved to the Executive Board.
  - Identification of Entries. Print and Slide Labels shall be affixed to entries, and the Entry Form shall be completed by the Club delegate or Club representative prior to submission of entries.
  - Assistance. At least one member of each competing Club must assist in conducting the competition.
- Judges. Judges shall be elected from outside the membership of organizations affiliated with the GWCCC. Judges shall be briefed on the GWCCC Competition Rules and on procedures to be followed during the judging. If necessary the competition may proceed with only two judges.
- 4. Awards. Awards shall be given to 25 percent of the Novice entries and 10 percent of the Advanced and Master entries. This includes First, Second and Third Places. When this calculation results in a fraction, the number of awards shall be rounded off using the 4/5 rule. (5 rounds up to next whole number, 4 or less round down.) In a class with 5 or fewer entries, only a First Place award shall be given to the entry judged the best.

- Care of Entries. All reasonable care of competition entries shall be exercised, but no responsibility will be assumed by the GWCCC for any loss in transit or during the competition or in any exhibition which may follow the competition.
- Compliance. The GWCCC Vice-President of Competitions shall
  have full responsibility for interpretation of these Competition Rules,
  for determining the compliance of entries and for responding to challenges during the competition. After the competition Appeals may
  be directed to the Executive Board in writing.
- Club Championship. The GWCCC will offer recognition to the Club whose members amass the most points in competition, Fall and Spring combined, stereo, medium format and other GWCCC sponsored competitions. The point scale for each class will be:

1st 6

2nd 4

3rd 2

HM I

A member may score points for only one club at any competition. Entries disqualified from competition will not be counted. The results will be announced at the June GWCCC meeting.

#### AMENDMENT

#### DECEMBER 8, 1986

8. Anyone disrupting the Judges (making comments out loud, talking to the Judges during voting, or otherwise interfering with the workers) can have all his entries disqualified from the competition. The Vice--President of competitions shall have sole authority on this matter, and his/her decision will be final.

#### June 14, 1993 Rule Changes

#### Change to I.B.6:

Maximum novice print size from 11x14 to 11x16.

#### Added to I.C.2:

Honorable Mention was added to the list of awards that may be submitted in a higher class.

#### Change to II. Competitions:

Prints and Slides will have the same subjects. And, there will no longer be combined subjects.

Three (3) entries per subject in all classes and categories.
