The objective will be to create an entire exhibit—about 50 images—from images in which lines, angles, or curves are the primary subject, or where lines, angles, or curves are strongly emphasized in a primary subject. This should provide Club members with an opportunity to tap their imaginations and unleash their creative juices. (How's that for a mangled metaphor!)

As noted in the May Cable Release (with a reminder in this issue), Lines, Angles, and Curves will also be the theme for the October 1993 Club competitions. This will provide an opportunity to subject our efforts to critical review well in advance of submitting them for the exhibit. It will also provide a chance to see what the competition is doing and may serve to further stimulate our creative juices. Speaking of which, I have noticed it is sometimes easier to be creative when you are slightly juiced. This is only a personal observation, however, and should not in any way be taken as a recommendation.

Consider this "alert" a fair warning. You have the summer and fall, and, if necessary, the winter and spring, to prepare your masterpieces. However, time has a way of slipping away unnoticed (especially for some of us older types). So get out there and get those images now. Remember the old photographer's adage, "Shoot first; ask questions later."
