


Our guest lecturer/judge will be Patricia Hanson. Pat and her partner, Mollic Isaacs, opened F2 Photography in 1983 and specialize in portraiture of children and families.

Competition is very important to Pat, who qualified in 1995 for her Master's Degree from Professional Photographers of America. She was named Maryland's Creative Photographer of the Year for two years in a row and has been first runner-up three times. Her photographs have been selected as Best Portrait of a Child 1990, Best Nature Photograph 1991, Best Commercial Photograph 1991 and 1993, and Best Creative Photograph 1992 and 1993. She has set another record by winning the Kodak Gallery Award of Excellence for three consecutive years, 1991, 1992, and 1993. In 1994 one of her portraits was selected for the permanent loan collection of the Professional Photographers of America and was displayed at Disney World's Epcot Center and across the country. Her work has been on exhibit in Dallas, Nashville, Atlanta, Denver, Orlando, Baltimore, Chicago, and Washington, D.C. She currently serves as President of the Virginia Professional Photographer's Association.
