Subject definitions...

<u>Abstract-Experimental</u> means either using blends of color, texture, shape, form, or light to create a design-patterned image, or using camera, darkroom, and/or computer manipulations to achieve an unreal image.

Nature means images that portray any aspects of natural plant or animal life, that illustrates the natural features of land or sea, or that reveal any natural phenomena, such as cloud formations, light refractions, sunsets, auroras, precipitation, frost, or fire, but which do not show the hand of man, such as buildings, fences, roads, soda cans, or anything manmade.

<u>People</u> means either full-length or close-up images of people including nudes and groups where the people rather than the activity are the main subject of interest, or storytelling images of people doing things where the activity itself is the subject.

If you feel you need a mask, it is important for you to know that there are many kinds, and that such masks are often very specific in their range of protection. The article Pat provided suggests that a "chlorine mask" is probably designed to remove only chlorine and will NOT protect the wearer from organic compounds. [note: On a very basic level, chemicals are divided into two categories: inorganic and organic. The difference rests on the carbon basis for some. These are Those without carbon are called "organic" chemicals. "inorganic."]

Therefore, if you are going to purchase a mask, you need to know the exact names of the chemicals to which you will be The article recommends a 3M Series 6000 Respirator for persons exposed to organic vapors. If you can't find them, the article suggests Lab Safety Supply, P.O. Box 1368, Janesville, WI 53547-1368. Phone 1-800-356-2855 for a catalog or 1-800-356-2501 for answers to technical questions.

A good respirator mask will completely cover your mouth and your nose. You may look funny, but live longer! On the other hand, you can take up a safe hobby like hang gliding. Also, no one will understand you when you speak, but to whom do you talk in the darkroom besides yourself?

Finally, remember that even the best respirator mask in the world is NO substitute for adequate ventilation whenever you use any volatile toxic substances.
