Our speaker is Jim Blair. He is a veteran photojournalist, with
48 stories to his credit in the National Geographic Magazine,
including major coverage of London, Czechoslovakia, Poland,
Ethiopia, West Africa, Iran, Greece and the United States. He
has articles on agriculture, coal, the uses of photography in
science, and cultural subjects like the Celts and the Etruscans.
His coverage of South Africa earned him the Overseas Press
Club of America Award for Best Photographic Reporting from
abroad. In 1983, he photographed Our Threatened Inheritance,
the Society's benchmark book on the U.S. federal lands. His
most recent story was on the first foreign sailing voyage down
the Volga River in Russia, published in June 1994.

Jim has studied with such renowned photographers as Harry Callahan and Aaron Siskind at the Institute of Design of the Illinois Institute of Technology in Chicago. He also photographed for Roy E. Stryker (director of the Farm Security Administration's Photographic Documentation of the 1930's), at the Pittsburgh Photographic Library. As a free-lance photographer he has had commissions from U.S. Information Agency, Time, Life, and National Geographic Magazine. He also put together a one man show at the Carnegie Museum in Pittsburgh and co-authored a book, "Listen With the Eye", with the poet Samuel Hazo.

Jim is regular instructor at the Maine Photographic Workshops and numerous other workshops. He has taught at the International Center of Photography, NY, the University of Missouri School of Journalism. Since retiring from the National Geographic Society in 1994, he has had assignments from Geo (Germany) Vermont Life, and Wooden Boat Magazines. He also worked on the book project, Discover Ecuador. In 1996, he covered the state of Vermont for the Corbis Archive, and this

year he photographed Washington, D.C. for them. Jim is represented by the National Geographic Society's Image Collection, which distributes his photography worldwide.

They produce digitally manipulated images for a National Client base. In addition to their work as commercial photographers, the pair have demonstrated a commitment to educating the photographic community about digital imaging by writing articles fro Photo District News, conducting seminars on digital imaging at Photo 96, Photo Plus West 97 and Photo Plus 97, and presenting courses on imaging at the Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore.

PHOTOGRAPHIC CONTEST RULES Revised and accepted April, 1994

The Council of Maryland Camera Clubs sponsors two photography contest each year as part of its effort to stimulate individual participation in amateur photography. The contests are open to all members of the clubs that are members of the Council of Maryland Camera Clubs (CMCC). All members compete on an individual basis against all other members in an individual contest.

ENTRY FEES: Contestants must pay \$3.00 for each category, even if only 1-3 images are entered. CATEGORIES OF ENTRIES: Monochrome prints, Color Prints, Commercial Color Prints, and Slides.

SUBJECT OR THEME: Open in all categories.

NUMBER OF ENTRIES: An individual may enter a maximum of 4 (four) entries in each category.

COMPETITION LEVEL: Compete in the level in which you compete at your club competitions. If you have accumulated 6 or more points in one category then you must must move to the next level. (1st=3 points, 2nd=2 points, 3rd=1 point)

ELIGIBILITY OF ENTRIES: A print or transparency may be entered in any two All-Maryland contests. Except if a picture has won a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place in a previous All-Maryland contest.

Any print or slide which is entered in an All-MaryInd Competition must have a UNIQUE title. Pictures titled "Untitled" or "Untitled #X" are ineligible for competition.

Each entry in the Monochrome Print, Color Print and Transparency categories must be **entirely the work of the contestant**, with the exception of the processing of negative, the mounting of prints, and the processing of
slides. (Prints you make on a **Create-A-Print** machine **do** qualify.)

In the Commercial Color Category, the original exposure must have been made by the contestant. All other work must be completed by someone other than the contestant.

MOUNTING OF PRINTS: Prints may be mounted on any size or shape of mount up to a maximum of 16 X 20. The mounting board must be of a nonabrasive material with no wall hanging or other fasteing devices.

MARKING OF ENTRIES:

Prints: Each print must have, on its back, the All-Maryland identification sticker or facsimile with the following information filled in:

- -TITLE, CLASS, CLUB, MAKER, CONTEST DATE (to be filled by contest committee).
- -PRINTS MUST NOT SHOW MAKER'S NAME ON FRONT.
- -ANY PRINT NOT MEETING THE ABOVE TWO CRITERIA WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

Slides: All slides must bear the name of the maker, the maker's club, the entrant's class and and the date of the contest, as described above. In addition, each slide must have the lower left-hand corner marked conspicuously when the slide is viewed in its normal position.

MONOCHROME PRINTS (There is no minimum print size.)

Novice Class: 11 X 14 is the maximum print size. Unlimited Class: 16 X 20 is the maximum print size.

COLOR PRINTS (There is no minimum print size.)

Novice Class: 11 X 14 is the maximum print size.
Unlimited Class: 16 X 20 is the maximum print size.

COMMERCIAL COLOR PRINTS (There is no minimum print size.)

General Class: 16 X 20 is the maximum print size.

TRANSPARENCIES (SLIDES)

Novice & Unlimited Class: 2" X 2" slide mounts are the maximum size in both classes.
