His work is found in books, posters, calendars, note paper, engagement books, etc. But perhaps the very ubiquity of his work prevents us from really seeing it. This problem is solved by visiting the Ansel Adams exhibit at the Museum of American Art, now through March 29th. This exhibit consists of 100 of Adams' prints, and they cover the full range of his photographic interests. For those who know Adams only through reproductions, the exhibit will be a revelation. There is no reproduction that can do justice to the perfect marriage of photographic craftsmanship and artistry embodied in this work. It is hard to imagine any one possessing the printing and darkroom skills of Adams. We are led into each print and there are discoveries to be made at every turn, in every photograph. This exhibit can not be praised too highly. It is an event that should not be missed The Museum of American Art is located in D.C. at 8th and G, NW.

Our speakers will be Gordie Corbin and Judy Switt. They have been members of the North Bethesda Camera Club for over 25 years. They have been consistent winners in NBCC, GWCC, and PSA competitions. They are "self-taught" photographers who enjoy photographing every imaginable subject in both black and white, and color.

They have written articles for national magazines and their photographs have been published and exhibited throughout the area. Subject: Architecture

Our Speaker will be Warren Kahle, a 29-year resident of Prince George's County and Bowie. He considers his strength to be in visual composition, i.e. an awareness of how to integrate subject matter within a scene into reasonably well organized images possessing graphic qualities, which stimulate the interest of the viewer.

. He has been identified as a travel, nature, and landscape photographer, but his work in recent years had stressed portraiture, especially environmental photography.

. Four of his competition prints were accepted for display (and earned merits) at the 1997 International Print Exhibition of the PP of A held in Las Vegas in July. He is also a member of the Bowie-Crofton Camera Club in which he won Photographer of the Year recognition in 1993, 1996 and 1997. He has served as competition judge and speaker for camera clubs throughout the Washington-Baltimore area.

His work has been selected for display in several Prince George's County juried exhibitions, 5 individual shows and several group shows at Capital Gallery at the US Air Arena (Capital Centre). He now operates a photography, framing studio in Bowie.
