He started the Owens Valley Workshops with Bruce Barnbaum and Ray McSavaney that went on for seventeen years.

His first book, "Quiet Light", sold out in just months. The deluxe editions at \$300 were sold out before publication and were selling at auctions for \$1400. Both Quiet Light and his second book, "Listen To The Trees" won more awards than we could list here. His third, "Places of Power" will be on sale at the seminar.

Meeting Cancellations


If the schools in Montgomery County are closed or close early, there will be no SSCC meeting. Unless you hear otherwise, this will apply whether the library is closed or not.
