
Directions to April Digital Workshop

Speakers for the slide meeting will be SSCC's Bernie Van Leer and Stan Klem. Bernie will present a brief slide presentation about the extraordinary architecture of the Guggenheim Museum at Bilboa, Spain. His enthusiasm for this subject is obvious to anyone he has spoken to about it!

Stan Klem's presentation will be on his approach and techniques on photographing people, especially children, as well as some simple techniques of portrait lighting, using natural window light or studio lights.



Clarence has been active in area camera clubs, MPPA, and SMP for a number of years. He founded the Maryland Photographic Alliance in 1991, which has met each month ever since, with a current membership of about 22 photographers/writers/painters.



Night Duty

The explosive crash of the fire door against the tile wall jarred me to my senses. I was instantly wide awake.

Through his black ski mask burned two fiery eyes, and they were riveted on me. I grabbed for the railing to hoist myself off the concrete stairs, but an arm the size of a two by four flailed at me and broke my grip. I gasped and pulled back, crouching against my knees. He ripped at my scrub suit, tearing it down the front and scattering my pens and notes. I tried to scream, but he clamped his fingers around my neck and brought his other hand up high. When I saw the glint of the blade and the blood caked on it, I rolled out of his grasp and down one stair. He grabbed at me with his free hand. I fumbled for my stethoscope, swung it wildly, and the knife became airborne. He tore the stethoscope from me, and pressed me to the wall

with the rubber tubes against my neck. I kicked and punched, but I still couldn't breathe.

The newsreel of my life flashed by me in a second. They would need me soon in the intensive care unit. It was midnight and I had to draw arterial blood gases at midnight. Why hadn't anyone heard us? The nurses' station was only a few feet from the fire door.

I thrashed from side to side and then arched my back against the cold wall. I pushed hard and fast, and he lost his balance. Then I saw the surveillance camera above the next landing. He toppled back and I grabbed for his waist, rolling down the stairs with him in tow. At the next landing, he was on top of me, slamming my shoulders and head against the floor. I prayed that the guard at the front desk was looking at his monitors, and for once my wish came true.

I awoke under hot lights amidst the turmoil of the emergency room. A bottle of intravenous saline was dripping into tubes above my head, and there were wires taped to my chest.

"We caught the guy." A blue shirt with silver buttons and a badge hovered over me. "He killed a patient in the intensive care unit, and you were just lucky. That camera saved your life."

For almost two years I had wandered the hall-ways and stairwells and tunnels of the Yale-New Haven Hospital, and I had never thought twice about walking alone or dozing in the stairwell at three o'clock in the morning. That night they kept me til dawn in the emergency room. I pulled my own IV at 6 AM and stumbled off to the surgical ICU for rounds with the chief. That evening I shared a pizza with my new buddy at the security station. Together we watched the 24 surveillance cameras rotating their images on a half-dozen monitors.

Photoshop High Speed Performance

It took awhile, but I have learned that the key short cuts are really worth learning and using. Even if you are one of those hunt & peck typists, it will become second nature and really speed up your Photoshop performance. The toolbox has fly out menus for single letter keys, and I personally find it just as easy to use my mouse to click on them. The exception might be the rubber stamp (S) or the move

tool (V). My favorite keystroke is the bracket keys next to the letter "P". This key increases or decreases the brush size.

I try to avoid going up to the drop down menus so I can to minimize the searching. It is easy to remember if one of the keys is the same. The control key is that key that has the entire alphabet associated with it, plus some other functions. Look carefully at the list below and those who remember keyboard controls from word processing will see some familiar strokes. Photoshop does change a few. Try them out and you'll speeding along..

My most used combinations of control + keystroke are **in bold letters.**

CONTROL KEY + KEYBOARD BUTTON:

A = select the entire image

B = select the color balance adjustment

C = copy to the clipboard

D = deselect what has been selected

E = merge down a single layer (flatten)

F = filter, repeat with last settings

G = group with previous layer (clipping group)

H = hide or show marching ants

I = invert colors to complement (negative)

J = copy a selection to a layer

K = open general preferences menus

L = select levels adjustment

M = select curves adjustment

N = new document, specifications

O = open file

P = print, with preview PS-7

Q = quit Photoshop

R = display or hide ruler

S = save

T = invoke free transform (selection required)

U = select hue/saturation adjustment

V = paste from the clipboard

W = close image or file browser

Y = proof printer colors without correction

X = cut selection

Z =undo last operation

0 (Zero) = fit screen

Backspace = fill with background color

Tab = bring forward next open window

Arrow keys = moves selection 1 pixel
