
The "Silver Spring Camera Club Competition Rules and Awards" (II Categories, paragraph 6) states:

"Print entries may be mounted on boards of a size acceptable for the club's print viewing box (approx. 24" high); total print area may not exceed 11" x 14" for novice class; 16" x 20" for advanced class."

Photoshop Tricks

Adding Fill Flash

(Extracted from Stan Klem's December digital imaging workshop – with credit to Katrin Eismann.)

Have you ever taken a photo with strong back-lighting and an underexposed foreground—such as, a photo of a person against a sky. To make the picture presentable, we should have used fill flash to brighten the shadows (caused by the strong backlighting). Although it is too late to take the picture over again, we can still bring back the brightness and detail in the shadow area by employing a Photoshop technique that gives a fill flash effect.

- 1. Duplicate the Original image by choosing Image > Duplicate.
- 2. Select Image > Mode > Grayscale to convert the duplicate file to grayscale.
- Select Filter > Blur > Gaussian Blur and use a 3to 6-pixel Radius setting to soften the details.
 (Note: Use a smaller Gaussian Blur setting for small files under 5 MB and higher settings for larger files.) Select OK.
- 4. Invert the tonal values with Image > Adjustments > Invert (or Ctr +1) to create a negative image. (This negative image will be used to mask the digital fill-flash.)

- 5. Now, return to the original color image and choose Select > Load Selection. Check that your B&W mask image is selected in the Document pull-down menu. Click OK. (You should now see a "marching ants" selection around your foreground subject.)
- Select Layer > New > Layer Via Copy (Cmd+J) (Ctrl+J) to create a new layer based on the active selection.
- 7. To fill the new layer select Edit > Fill; for Contents use 50% Gray, change the blending mode to Color Dodge, and check Preserve Transparency to tell Photoshop to ignore all clear areas of the new layer. Click OK.
- 8. Notice how much lighter the image is now. If need be, use the Eraser tool with an opacity of about 20% on any affected areas in the sky that don't need to be lighter.
- 9. If necessary, duplicate the new layer to increase the effect of the fill-flash and experiment with the layer's opacity to fine-tune the effect to your liking.
