Proposal To Increase Membership Dues

The SSCC Board of Directors has proposed a \$5 increase in the annual club dues. This will raise the per year amount for a single member from \$30 to \$35, for a married couple from \$50 to \$55, and for a student from \$20 to \$25. As per SSCC By-Laws (Article XII, Sect. 2), interested members may speak on the proposed change prior to the Board's final vote in mid-April. (Members interested in speaking on this issue may do so at the March Slide or Print meeting, or by emailing President Mike Lux (mlux@erols.com). If the proposal passes, announcements will be made in the May Cable Release and at the May Slide and Print meetings. The new rate will take effect at the beginning of the next fiscal year—i.e., September 2004.

Digital Imaging Workshop



Pedro's Prescriptions

Que Pasa Con Tu Workflow

Can't decide whether to shoot jpeg, tiff or raw? Do you find yourself switching back and forth? Do you work on an image and end up with multiple versions at various stages with different names? Do you get confused, don't know what day it is, can't remember if you took your pills?

Sorry to give you the bad news-you have Workflow Deficiency Syndrome. Don't panic, WDS is common and, best of all, easily cured with simple over-the-counter remedies. The following prescription will assume you are not shooting an object to put on eBay, that the image you are making is important, your computer is robust and will not break out in rash.

RAW stands for raw data format. Every image is shot in raw even when you tell it to shoot jpeg. Raw is a roll of exposed film before processing. Tiff is often incorrectly thought of as equal to raw. The false logic being that it doesn't compress a file like jpeg and therefore contains all the data. Tiff (like jpeg or anything other than raw) is processed data. Just as film can not be developed more than once, processed data can not be unprocessed.

Shoot your image in raw. Make a backup copy and archive it. Open and adjust globally. That means minimum changes; things like dust and scratches, and most importantly—cropping which will reduce the size of the file. You are spotting the negative. The file then becomes the master neg and you save it as a tiff. No need to change the name, the extension will handle that. Matter of fact-never change the name. Make a backup of the tiff and archive it in the same folder with the raw one. Now the moment comes that you have been waiting for-you can go crazy! Do anything your heart desires with the tiff, just be sure to save it as a psd. I didn't say pdf. PSD is a photoshop file format. Now you have the option to confuse yourself again by creating multiple PSDs. A doctor can only do so much for a patient. As you get better you will only have 1 or 2 psd files and maintain your sanity, until then don't be calling me.

Size the print with resampling turned off. Forget about resolution for a moment. Your test print is not going to be the big mamoo. Make it about 4x6. You start to panic. "Doctor, my resolution is going through the roof!" Fahgetaboutit, make the print. Need more adjustment-leave the file size and resolu-

tion as is and continue to adjust/print until you have found Adobe Heaven (AH! for short).

Now you are ready to resize the file, again with resampling off. Resampling may be needed only if the resolution drops too low (for me that's under 288). I never resample down a file for printing. I'm just telling you what I do. If you feel you need a second opinion, that's your prerogative. Some say, if the resolution is high it slows the printer down. If it happens to you, then knock it down—it never has for me. I'll say it a different way—the resolution of the file doesn't matter if it is more than 360 dpi, the resolution you tell the printer to print at WILL affect the speed. The choice in the printer options will be 360, 720, 1440, or 2880.

Let's say the final print is 12x18. We have a file called xyz.raw (or xyz.nef if you are a Nikon user), xyz.tiff and an xyz.psd. The finished print will be called xyz_12x18.tiff. Don't forget to sharpen this file and save. Prior to this step, no sharpening should have been applied-even in camera or by the scanner. If you're happy and you know it, trash your PSDs. Add this new tiff to your archive collection. If you also need a 6x9, turn off resampling, change the size and print. You haven't altered the file in any way and (Get This)... you don't need to resharpen. Yes, bow down before thee; this is an original pedro discovery. If you find it in print anywhere anytime, I want to know about it. (Die Plagiarist Bastards!) No need to keep a copy of this file either. Close and don't save. The master print negative (you can think of it as the contact neg) is called xyz 12x18.tiff. The dimensions, whatever you make it, indicate it is the contact neg.

If you want to email the image or put it on a webpage—resize, sample down (now you WANT to sample down) and Save As a jpeg. Don't forget to resharpen this one. I work entirely in 16 bit mode and change to 8 bit only when I need a jpeg. Resizing with resampling turned off eliminates the need of other programs like Genuine Fractals and works much better because with GF it is necessary to save the unsharpened image and resharpen every time it is opened.

The Photographic Society of America (PSA) Mid Atlantic Chapter (MAC) conducted its annual competition on January 17, 2004. A panel of three outstanding photographers judged the competition. SSCC member Henry Ng, did exceptionally well. He captured the top prize in every category except the Stereo section! In addition, he broke many MAC annual competition records including: (a) the highest number of Best of Show awards won by an individual–5; (b) the highest number of PSA Gold medals won by an individual–8; and (c) the highest number of medals won by an individual–13 out of a total of 26 Medals in the regular sections excluding Stereo. Henry's winning results are as follows:

1. Mono Print Section:

- a. Best of Show in Mono Prints (PSA Gold Medal): "Hungry Ones".
- b. 3rd place (PSA Bronze Medal): "Going to Work"

2. Color Print Section:

- a. Best of Show in Color Prints (PSA Gold Medal): "Merrith Farm"
- b. Best Creative (PSA Gold Medal): "Kick It"
- c. Top 25: "Autumn Mill"

3. Nature Color Slide Section:

- a. Best of Show in Nature Slides (PSA Gold Medal): "I am King"
- b. 2nd Place (PSA Silver Medal): "Land Wave"
- c. 3rd Place (PSA Bronze Medal): "Moth"

4. Photojournalism Color Slide Section:

- a. Best of Show in Photojournalism Slides (PSA Gold Medal): "Nothing Left"
- b. Best Humor (PSA Gold Medal): "Got You"
- c. 2nd Place (PSA Silver Medal): "Oh, My Umbrella"

5. Pictorial Color Slide Section:

Fourth Annual Worldwide Pinhole Photography Day

The Worldwide Pinhole Photography Day Coordinating Team announces the fourth annual Worldwide Pinhole Photography Day, to be celebrated all over the world on Sunday, 25 April 2004.

People throughout the world are invited to make a pinhole photograph during these twenty-four hours. Each author will be able to submit an image to the unique and international WPPD gallery at www.pinholeday.org.

This event is absolutely popular, egalitarian and open to anybody, anywhere in all world's regions. All lovers of lensless photography, as well as people who have never tried this creative and enjoyable technique, are encouraged to participate.

Pinhole photographs are made without lenses, using a tiny hole as the image-forming device. Photographs are made with simple and inexpensive tools: from shoeboxes and tomato tins to pinholes fitted on regular cameras. A world of pure creativity, a tender and joyful approach to photography, and the discovery of the emotion and the wonder of the photographic action itself, far from the excessive and oppressive power of extreme technology, await the pinhole photographer.

The WPPD web exhibition of 2001 showed 291 pictures by pinhole photographers from 24 nations, the 2002 exhibition contained 903 photographs from 35 nations; in 2003, 1082 pinhole photographers from 43 nations participated.

On 25 April 2004 there will be numerous events all over the world dedicated to the pinhole photography: meetings, lectures, workshops and informal gatherings to celebrate the Fourth Worldwide Pinhole Photography Day and to increase the former editions' success.

WPPD is the result of the work of a group of volunteers from across the globe. Their combined efforts and individual skills contribute to make this event an ever-growing success, allowing more and more people to discover the beauty and mysteries of pinhole photography.

SSCC will again host an inter-club competition versus the NIH and Bowie-Crofton Camera Clubs at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, March 18 at the Long Branch Library. This will be the fourth such annual competition and the second hosted by SSCC.

The rules are simple, as they have been in previous years. This is an open competition and there are no class distinctions. Each member may enter up to 3 slides, 3 color prints, and 3 monochrome prints.

Generally speaking, the rules are the same as SSCC's regular monthly competitions. Previous winners in our Intra-club competition are eligible, but previous winners in this annual Inter-club competition are not eligible. Additionally, color is color whether commercial, digital, hand colored, or otherwise. Points are awarded according to "SSCC Competition Rules and Awards." Individuals who

are members of multiple clubs may represent only one club in this competition.

Entries will be collected at the March 04 SSCC Slide meeting. You can also bring your entries on

It is not too early to start selecting your images for this competition and/or to start shooting some new images. Both of these other clubs have some great photographers. This is a fun competition and it is always interesting to see the fine array of images.

Silver Spring / NIH / Bowie - Crofton Inter-Club Competition Rules

March 18, 2004

- Each participating club must supply at least one representative for recording their entries and winners.
- Competition is to be open, i.e., no assigned categories.
- There shall be no class distinction.
- Each participant may enter up to 3 slides, 3 color prints, and 3 B&W prints.
- Slides must be of 35 mm format.
- Prints may be any size up to 20 x 24 max.
- Color is color whether commercial, computer, hand colored, or otherwise.
- Slides must be identified by title, maker and club, and spotted on lower left.
- Prints must be identified on reverse by title, maker, and club, with prominent arrow pointing up.
- Individuals who are members of multiple clubs may represent only one club in this competition.
- Each participating club's rules will determine which of their members' images are eligible to be entered in this competition, except that these stated rules shall always take precedent.
- Work must be delivered either individually or by delegate on night of competition and logged in prior to competition, which will begin <u>promptly</u> at 7:30 pm. Once registration closes, no more entries will be accepted.
- There is no fee for entry. All costs, if any, will be borne by SSCC.
- First, second, and third places, plus HMs for 10% of total entries in each category, will be recognized.

- No hard awards will be made.
- The SSCC Board has determined that points earned in this inter-club competition will apply towards club awards. Unless specifically noted otherwise, all other [SSCC inTRA-]club [(monthly)] rules will apply.
