For over 30 years, versatile photographer and writer Ed Funk has created many award winning photographs and written several travel articles. He has also written and co-authored several publications for the Northern Virginia Alliance of Camera Clubs and given lectures on all aspects of photography at area colleges and universities. Ed also presented his creativity workshop at the University of Massachusetts for the New England Council of Camera Clubs, at the Kutztown University for the Berks Camera Club, and at Georgetown University. Currently, Ed serves the local community by judging photographic shows and competitions, conducts workshops on creative photography and digital imaging, and designs and builds Web sites.

Ed's images have been published in leading magazines and newspapers and on Annual Report covers. His work has been widely exhibited, including a solo exhibition at George Mason University. One of his prints was on exhibit at the Smithsonian Institution in October 2003; and his print "Middleburg Farm in Winter" was honored in the American Landscape show. Ed's work was also featured on public television's "Photographers of Northern Virginia." His work resides in public and private collections.

Ed is a past president of the Northern Virginia Photographic Society, has served on the board for 15 years, and is a six time NVPS "Photographer of the Year." He is also a member of the Art League in Alexandria, Virginia. Recently, Ed taught photography in Italy, Turkey, England, and Germany. He has been influenced by the writings and teachings of Freeman Patterson, Joseph Miller, Ernst Haas, John Shaw, Bill Allard, and others.


SSCC Meeting Location

All SSCC Slide and Print Meetings for this Club year (2004-5) will be held at the Marvin Memorial United Methodist Church at Four Corners in Silver Spring. Directions are as follows:

From downtown Silver Spring: go north on Colesville Road (Rte. 29); take a right onto University Blvd. East; then a left into the church parking lot A.

From College Park/Takoma Park: take University Blvd. West. As you approach Rte. 29, move to your far left lane and turn left into church parking lot B. Or, you can pass through Rte. 29 intersection and turn left at the loop just past MacDonalds. Proceed on University Blvd. East, pass through Rte. 29 intersection, and quickly get in the far left lane and enter into church parking lot A.

From points north of Four Corners: proceed south on Rte. 29 and turn right onto University Blvd. West through, move into the far left lane



and turn left at the loop just past the MacDonalds. Proceed through Rte. 29 intersection, and turn left into church parking lot A.

From Wheaton and points west of Four Corners, go east on University Blvd. As you pass through Route 29 intersection, turn left into parking lot A.

Wherever you park, walk to the southeast corner of the Church and enter Room 204. All of our meetings begin at 7:30 p.m.

January Slide Meeting Mini-Portfolio

"Norm" claims that he never made a 'decent' photograph until he joined SSCC in 1977, 27 years ago. But, one of his most striking photographs was made in 1961 when he was only 15. Norm began his darkroom work while in college, first in his own makeshift darkroom and then during a summer job processing "While You Wait" photographs at an amusement park.

For nearly 30 years Norm has worked in the computer field, and is currently a senior computer analyst for the Computer Sciences Corporation. Five years ago he became a part-time Staff Photographer at the Montgomery Sentinel. This position has given him prime access to many top-level sporting events and the chance to get interesting and unique photos.

Norm has been SSCC's treasurer, vice-president, president, director several times over, a club delegate, web master, and since 1991, the club historian. He has managed the club's competition database since 1985. He also managed the GWCCC competitions for many years and was responsible for establishing the GWCCC computer database—at a time when personal computers were barely in use.

His mini-portfolio includes a selection of images spanning most of Norm's career as a photographer.

Advanced Digital Imaging Workshop



The creative assignment for February is as follows. Here's the scenario; you want to make a presentation to a gallery hoping they will accept your images for a one-person show. You will have to decide whether you make a selection of what you consider your best overall images or make a selection of your best themed images with a congruous message. Or whatever you feel is best for your presentation. The presentation must consist of at least 10 images and no more than 20 images. You will have to make a decision on how you want to present the images; as matted prints in a portfolio box, in a portfolio book or binding, on a CD as a slide show or website, etc. The presentation is left to your imagination and creativity and can be anything you choose to do. The challenge then is to select your images and figure out the best method to present them to the gallery owner with the hopes that you will be selected to do a one-person show in the near future.

Each member will have up to 15 minutes at our February session to "sell" the group on their images and to acquire an invitation for a one-person show.

Of worthy note, Bruce Frasier, one of the top Photoshop gurus, has just published a book about Adobe Camera Raw. I've started the book and have already found out many interesting facts about the plug-in and, most interesting is the usage for each tool. The tools are non-destructive to the file, which gives you tons of latitude versus the file hammering that Photoshop itself does with any corrections you make. Adobe is attempting to standardize the RAW format conversion and have a universal tool for importing camera RAW files from any manufacturers RAW format, thus those like me with multiple cameras only have to learn one program.

My Fuji S3 Pro arrived. It's basically a \$2,500 brick at the moment. Adobe Camera Raw doesn't support the "new" RAF format, even in the 2.4 beta version now available for hardy, daring Photoshoppers to try out. Fuji shipped a piece of junk software that lets you convert the RAF file into an eight bit TIF with absolutely no control except for renaming the file. So the S3 will stay in the box until Fuji gets their act together.

Finally, A Terrific Photoshop Book!

I have looked at (and have purchased) far too many Photoshop books, but invariably I end up disappointed. Most books are either far too technical or detailed for me. They may contain very worthwhile tips, but finding them amongst all that mumbo jumbo often seems like a county wide Easter egg hunt, at best. So often, they never give me practical and easy to understand solutions to common issues. Other books are less technical, but are either too sketchy or poorly written.

I believe that my frustration with most Photoshop books is not unusual. Finally, however, just like the 2004 Red Sox, after too long a wait, I have found a winner! It's called: "The Photoshop CS Book for Digital Photographers," by Scott Kelby. For me, it is the "My Fair Lady" of them all. So much so, that I feel compelled to spread the word, as best I can.

Unlike so many Photoshop books, this one is beautifully written and illustrated. Furthermore, its approach is not the typical text on "tell me everything" about this and that Photoshop capability. Instead, it contains step-by-step solutions in easy to follow illustrated text on a variety of the most common practical image problems and Photoshop tasks we face. We are not talking basics, either! Many of the tips will be new and well appreciated for most Photoshop users no matter their experience level. All are rather easy to follow.

So, fellow club members, I encourage you to check this book out. You won't be sorry, in spite of its \$39.99 retail price tag. You can trust the judgment of your ex-El Presidente on this one.
