
From downtown Silver Spring: go north on Colesville Road (Rte. 29); take a right onto University Blvd. East; then left into the church parking lot A.

From College Park/Takoma Park: take University Blvd. West. As you approach Rte. 29, move to your far left lane and turn left into church parking lot B. Or, you can pass through Rte. 29 intersection and turn left at the loop just past MacDonalds. Proceed on University Blvd. East, pass through Rte. 29 intersection, and quickly get in the far left lane and enter into church parking lot A.

From points north of Four Corners: proceed south on Rte. 29 and turn right onto University Blvd. West, move into the far left lane and turn left at the loop just past the MacDonalds. Proceed through Rte. 29 intersection, and turn left into church parking lot A.

From Wheaton and points west of Four Corners, go east on University Blvd. As you pass through Route 29 intersection, turn left into parking lot A.

Wherever you park, walk to the southeast corner of the Church and enter Room 204. All of our meetings begin at 7:30 p.m.




How to Mark Slides & Prints

October Competition Meeting

with Judge Tim Edberg

Our annual nature competition will be held on October 20th for both Slides and Prints. After all six competitions are completed, the judge will review all six first place winning entries and choose a single Best of Show. The photographer of that Best of Show image will win the Joyce Bayley Award for this year along with a gift certificate for a 20x24 digital color print.

According to our Competition Rules and Awards (Sep / 2004), Nature is defined as . . .

"Pictures that portray different kinds of various aspects of natural plant and animal life in a living state, that illustrates the natural features of land and sea or that reveal certain natural phenomena, such as cloud formations, light refractions (sunsets auroras etc.), precipitation, frost, fire, but which **do not show the hand of man**, such as buildings, fences, beer cans, etc. Domestic plants or animals may be included, provided they do not show the hand of man".

Any image that has previously won the Joyce Bayley Award is ineligible for future entry in the Joyce Bayley nature competition in another (slide or print) category.

Crash Night, October 13th

Dr. Pedro, a.k.a. Pete Manzelli, will be conducting our first educational meeting known as CRASH Night on Thursday, October 13 at 7:30 p.m. Please arrive early to help set up the room. A wide variety of topics will be discussed. Those of you familiar with Cliff Notes will appreciate the direct and concise approach to understanding. His latest digital discovery is detailed below.

Shadow/Highlight Voodoo, or the Search for Atmospheric Ambiance

Shadow and Highlight Voodoo, or You Take the Low Road and I'll . . .

Did you know that Multiply in the Layer Mode decreases exposure by about one stop? And that Screen increases the exposure also by one stop? You may find a combination of the two actually works better than the beloved Shadows/Highlights adjustment feature that was added to Photoshop CS. The Shadows/Highlights method is at a big disadvantage in that it is not easy to go back and change later on since it cannot be applied as an Adjustment Layer. These two methods, however, create different results. Since discovering this technique I have lost interest in S/H adjustment as a panacea and I want to share it with you. Here it is:

Create a new Levels Adjustment Layer and change the blend mode to Multiply. Layer>New Adjustment Layer>Levels and when the dialog box opens, change the Mode (lower left) to Multiply. You can play with the sliders later if you choose. For now, just click OK. The result is a darker image which can be easily adjusted using the Opacity slider in the Layers dialog box.

Repeat these steps substituting Curves for Levels and Screen for Multiply. For some reason, Levels works better for shadows and Curves works better for highlights (at least for me). Fine tuning is very precise and easy, and more importantly can be changed at any time. By double clicking the icon of the Adjustment Layer, which incidentally automatically includes a separate symbol for the levels and curves, the dialog box will reappear. Having two different symbols helps easily differentiate between the Levels/shadows and Curves/highlights. Go back now and bend the line in Curves if you haven't already. Between the dialog boxes and the opacity slider, the control is smooth and infinite.

For cases when extreme methods are needed, you could try starting with about half or less of the default Shadow and Highlight Adjustment and then apply the above technique. When time allows, using more than one method is often better than relying on one fast and easy [canned] technique. The feeling of total control is fun when working on special images that are important to you. An Auto Adjustment is something best done on your car or left to wedding photographers!

Expert Power Users may want to group both adjustment layers in a Layer Set which provides yet another opacity slider. The Sets can then be duplicated and adjusted separately, one for the foreground and one for the background then use Layer Masks to selectively apply ANY of the adjustments you have made. Taken to extremes you should be able to create your very own Landscape in Fog! However, it does not work well in reality. So, the search for atmospheric voodoo will continue.

I hope to see you at the first CRASH Night meeting and do not forget to bring a notebook.

SSCC Member Spotlight



Elsa Brandt

Elsa joined her first camera club (The New York Color Slide Club) in September of 1963, while she was still a Grad Student at the Manhattan School of Music. Someone she had never met before (Carl Brandt) joined that club the same evening. The very next day they were out and about taking photos together--and 42 years later they're still at it. They married 7 months later in April of 1964, moved to the Washington, DC area in 1966, and joined the Silver Spring Camera Club in the late 1960s. Back then Elsa photographed with a point-and-shoot 35mm camera and shot mostly Kodachrome. Today, all of her photography is done digitally -- with a 3 MP Fuji S5000. She presently uses Photoshop Elements 3 for image adjustments, and makes her prints (up to 11 x 14) on an HP DeskJet 9650. She especially enjoys making close-ups and landscapes.

Elsa holds a Masters degree in Music, has played as a violinist with the Hartford, Conn. and New Orleans, La. Symphony Orchestras and also as a freelance musician in the Washington, DC area. She taught at Howard University in DC for 22 years, founded the Maggini String Quartet, and also maintained a private teaching studio.

She is a member and past President of the American String Teachers Association MD-DC chapter, a lifetime member of the College Music Society, and a Solo member of the Friday Morning Music Club (since 1967). Recently, she has been selected to appear in the 2006-2007 Marquis editions of "Who's Who in American Education" and "Who's Who of American Women."

New Technology in the Art of Photography Exhibited by Historic Museum

The Sandy Spring Museum will present an exhibition of contemporary "sprayed ink" photographs. Sprayed ink is a new technology for photographic printing which is sometimes called Giclee or inkjet. All photographers in this show have used special dye and pigment inks on watercolor papers. Organized and curated by Bert GF Shankman, an expressionist flower photographer and master printer, it will include the works of 16 artists. Some locally known artists in the show are Danny Conant, Libby Cullen, Min Enghauser, Judith Goodman, Colleen Henderson, Allan Hockett, Barbara Southworth, Barbara Tyroler, and Frank Van Riper. The photographs are in both black and white and in color and include among others: images of historical architecture; x-ray pictures of flora; Nepalese portraits; and panoramic landscapes. At the Opening Reception most of the artists will be available to discuss their work.

Opening Reception will be on Sunday, September 25 from 2 to 4 p.m. Admission is free. The show will be on display from Sept. 21 to Dec. 21, 2005.
