Photographic Adventure - June 15-24, 2017

A one of a kind! This is the only photographic adventure that focuses on photographing the Corpus Christi Festival where participants are lead, guided and instructed by a professional photographer. All along, Essdras will share his approach to photographing the location, its people and the extraordinary activities of the festival and documenting the relaxed atmosphere of Cuenca.

Introduction:

Against the backdrop of the exciting and colorful, 460-year-old Corpus Christi Festival, spend a week with award winning photographer, Essdras Suarez, photographing the city with the most laid-back culture in Ecuador—Cuenca (Santa Ana de los Ríos de Cuenca)—and outlying areas.

After what will most likely be a late arrival in Quito, Ecuador, take time to adjust to the altitude and get a good night's rest.

In the morning meet as a group to get some photographic tips and guidance from Essdras and an

overview of the week ahead. Then, prepare to spend a fund day photographing Quito' historic "Old Town."

The next day, after an early morning flight over the Andes Mountains, you will begin your adventure in Cuenca.

A UNESCO World Heritage Trust site, Cuenca has been celebrating its Spanish heritage and indigenous traditions of Pachamama and giving thanks to the harvest, with a Corpus Christi Festival since 1557. The Festival integrates commemoration, gastronomy, culture, religion and folk arts.



This celebration is a photographer's delight!

During this week, Cuenca is full of colors, fireworks, folk dances and traditional music. The Parque Calderon is full of people enjoying the spectacle of burning castles and illuminates while people revel at the sights, enjoying the aromas and flavors of the Corpus candy.

And every night, when night falls, the skies are illuminated with colored lights.

Without a doubt, Corpus Christi Festival is an event not to be missed!

Overview:

While enjoying the festival's activities, you will spend some time touring this colorful city and its architecture, stop at a hat-making factory, visit studios of local ceramists and take time to wander the largest market in Cuenca.

In addition, you will be making excursions outside of Cuenca to visit the:

- Cajas National Park – with a richness of unique vegetation, animals and birds
- First the Inca complex at Ingapirca, the largest known Inca ruins in Ecuador
- Picturesque artisan villages of Chordeleg, San Bartolome and Guanaco
- The Yunguilla Reserve, one of the most visually stunning valleys of the Azuay province

EMS Photo Adventures Philosophy

Be flexible, prepared, considerate, respectful and on time!!

Note: With the focus on photography, this adventure is geared to the advanced and intermediate photographer who is familiar and confident with their gear. Participants should have their own DSLR or Mirorless digital camera (preferably with multiple lenses), chargers, digital media storage devices, etc.

Daily Itinerary:

Day 1 – Thursday, Jun 15:

Take your flight to Mariscal Sucre International Airport, Quito, Ecuador arriving, more than likely, in the evening or later :

- If your flight arrives in the evening you will be met by the Andean Discovery staff and transported to the **Hotel Casa Gardenia**, Quito.

Because Quito is located at an altitude of 2900m above sea level, please take the time to let your body acclimatize to the elevation by moving a little more slowly, do not over-exert and drink plenty of water.

Day 2 - Friday, Jun 16:

- This morning you will begin with relaxing breakfast at the hotel and, then, gather as a group at 9:30 a.m. in either the breakfast room or lobby to meet your fellow travelers and be briefed on how you will spend the next 8 days—find out what Esdras has in store for you!
- After the briefing the group go on a tour of Quito's historic center—**Old Town**—a maze of colonial splendor and first city to be named a UNESCO world heritage site in 1979.

Lodging: Hotel Casa Gardenia, Quito / Meals: (B,L,D)

Day 3 – Saturday, Jun 17:

- Early morning flight (8:30) to **Cuenca** (Santa Ana de los Ríos de Cuenca) located in southern Ecuador's Andes Mountains.

The city, with its laid-back culture, clean streets and agreeable weather is known for its:

- Tomebamba River waterfront
- Handicrafts including Panama hats,
- Central plaza, Parque Calderón - home to the blue-domed Catedral Nueva and the 16th-century Catedral Vieja, now a religious museum.

Once you are settled into your hotel, join the group for lunch and:

- Tour **Cuenca** - Ecuador's most European city – with its 16th and 17th century Spanish colonial architecture and the city center.
- Visit the **Homero Ortega Panama Hat** museum and store devoted exclusively to the lasting legacy of the toquilla straw hat— the famous (but incorrectly known) “Panama hat.” Why the Panama Hat? The misnomer dates back to the era when Ecuador began exporting the hats through the Panama Canal and foreigners erroneously assumed the hats came from Panama. You will be able to photograph the hat-making process.

Lodging: Hotel San Juan - Cuenca / Included Meals (B, L, D)

Day 4 – Sunday, Jun 18:

- This morning our driver will take us on a short trip into the highlands to visit **Cajas National Park**. Between 3100 and 4450m above sea level, the park has a rich variety of unique vegetation, including the “paper tree” forest, and is home to a large variety of animals some of which are endemic or highly endangered.

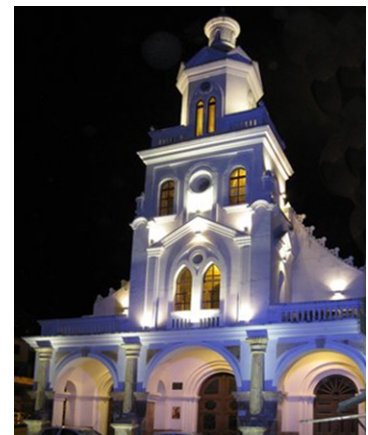
You may even see the South American condor, a Curiquinga, or the Giant Hummingbird (*Patagona gigas*), the largest humming bird in the world.

- The afternoon will be spend in Cuenca recording the festival activities.

Lodging: Hotel San Juan - Cuenca / Included Meals (B, L, D)

Day 5 – Monday, Jun 19:

- Spending the day in Cuenca, the group will focus on the many Corpus Christi street activities and look for those most unique opportunities to photograph people enjoying themselves.
- After dinner be ready for a sunset drive to **Mirado de Turi** (“Viewpoint



of Brother” in Quechau) where one gets the best view in Cuenca – a marvelous lookout point for panoramic photographs.

Lodging: Hotel San Juan - Cuenca / Included Meals (B, L, D)

Day 6 – Tuesday, Jun 20:

- Today visit the **Yunguilla Reserve**, one of the most visually stunning valleys of the Azuay province. The small 200 hectares reserve protects a remnant of Andean Mountain Scrub which is the last suitable habitat for the Critically Endangered Pale-headed Brush-finch.

The brush-finch is one of the Ecuadorian endemics and one of the rarest birds of the world with a population no greater than 240 individuals. Additionally, the Reserve houses the Little Woodstar, another endangered bird and a host of birds categorized as “Near Threatened and Restricted Range” species.

- After lunch in Cuenca you will have some time to organize your photographs and begin to select potentials to share with the group on Thursday.
- Join the group in an afternoon **meeting with Essdras**, where he will show some of his captures, give advice on and discuss issues pertaining to “street photography.”

Lodging: Hotel San Juan - Cuenca / Included Meals (B, L, D)

Day 7 – Wednesday, Jun 21:

- Travel into the hills surrounding Cuenca to visit the ceramic art gallery and workshop of **Eduardo Vega**, a artist known worldwide for his work. Inspired by the people, animals and landscapes of Ecuador, he makes a wide range of beautiful, useful and durable pieces. And, his shop sitting high on a hill offers a great panorama of Cuenca.

- We will return to Cuenca for lunch and spend part of the afternoon enjoying and photographing Corpus Christi events.
- Return to the hotel to take time to look over your images and select a three to five to share with your fellow travelers.

Lodging: Hotel San Juan - Cuenca / Included Meals (B, L, D)

Day 8 – Thursday, Jun 22:

Today will be a busy one spent outside of Cuenca:

- First our driver will takes us to the **Ingapirca Archaeological Complex**. It is the first and largest known Inca ruins in Ecuador. Here you will learn about the Canari and Inca cultures and photograph construction styles dating back 500 year and its most significant building– The Temple of the Sun.

- Next, you will travel to the picturesque artisan villages where we will learn about the artisan activity of the southern Ecuadorian Andes in:

- **Chordeleg** where you will meet some of the artists and learn about Ecuadorian jewelry and see some of the elaborate and prized jewelry created for the most demanding of clients.

- **La Macona** a city well known for the production of the famous “makanas” or shawls made with the technical weaving known as “IKAT”, which consists of different techniques that give threads unique designs to these items.
- In the afternoon, you will return to the hotel for a bit of leisure before joining Essdras for a review and critique of everyone’s photos, then, enjoy a farewell dinner

Lodging: Hotel San Juan - Cuenca / Included Meals: (B, L, D)

Day 9 - Friday, June 23

This day will be spent in Cuenca.

The morning will be spent visiting:

- The **Cementerio Patrimonial Cuenca** has a history dating back to 1843 and cemetery location dates back to the time of the Inca. The cemetery is unlike any you have likely seen. Surrounded by towering, white, burial chambers housing thousands of crypts you will find architecturally ornate mausoleums, beautifully maintained grounds and elaborate stone walkways.

- **Andrea Tello’s Jewelry** gallery and store. Andrea Tello is one of Ecuador’s most internationally famous artists, having exhibited her work at the Louvre in Paris and representing the whole of Latin America in events for UNESCO. You will view a video showing how artists create the elaborate filigree jewelry and have time to peruse the gallery.

Taught by her grandfather, Andrea is a fourth-generation filigree jeweler, working with silver, gold, and other metals. Her work is inspired by the symbolic patterns found in the clothing of Andean women and represents her history, culture, and heritage as well as her personal identity.

Late morning:

- Have group lunch
- Pack for the flight back to Quito and be prepared to check out at 2 p.m. Luggage will be held in the hotel storage until we are ready to leave for the airport.
- Wander the **Feria Libre Mercado** - one of the biggest Outdoor Markets in Cuenca where the farmers bring their crops to sell to the public. If you like fruits and vegetables it is a great place to shop. They have every kind of fruit and vegetable imaginable.

Late afternoon, return to the hotel and prepare to take a 8:20 pm flight to Quito.

Lodging: Quito Airport Wyndam Hotel / Included Meals: (B, L)

Day 10 - Saturday - Options:

- Take an early morning flight home.
- Extend your South American adventure and make arrangements with Andean Discovery for a five to seven-day trip to the Galapagos Islands or Machu Picchu.

Group Size: This will be a small group adventure - minimum of 8 - maximum of 12 participants.

Cost Per Person:

- \$3,140 Double occupancy
- \$3,830 Single occupancy (an additional \$690 for a single room)

The package includes, in addition to instruction, guidance and critiques by Essdras:

- All accommodations (standard 4-star hotels)
- Professional Andean Discovery guides
- Private ground transportation, internal flights and airport transfers:
 - Internal flights from Quito to Cuenca and return

The package does not include:

- The cost of transportation to and from Ecuador – including all costs associated with that activity such as baggage surcharges, taxes and fees.

- A \$500 per person deposit is required upon reservation and by March 14, 2017 to confirm participation.

Airport Departure Tax

\$25 USD Departure Tax is charged for international flights departing from Ecuador.

Luggage

Domestic airline regulations permit 20 kilos (44 pounds) per suitcase, maximum two suitcases per person.

Visas

Citizens of the United States, Canada and most European countries are not required to obtain a visa for Non-Working Stays Up to 90 Days (Visa 12-X) Ecuador.

Specific Requirements:

- Valid passport for more than 6 months.
- Return ticket (for air, land or sea travel).
- Proof of economic means to support yourself during your stay in Ecuador (may be requested by Immigration authorities upon arrival).

Health Risks

No inoculations are required for entry. However, it is recommended to get vaccinations for hepatitis A and B, typhoid, and there is a minor risk of cholera and rabies.

Financial

- VISA, Mastercard, American Express, and Diner's Club are the most widely recognized cards in Ecuador.
- Credit cards are useful for purchases in hotels, shops, restaurants, and for cash advances from Automated Teller Machines or banks.
- We recommend you should also carry some cash, especially in out-of-the-way places such as Andean or coastal villages. Carry mostly \$1, \$5, and \$10 bills, and make sure they are in good condition or you could have trouble using them as everybody checks for fraud bills if it's a 5 or higher.

Local Taxes and Tiping:

- With each purchase, you pay a tax of 12% IVA. Sometimes it's included in the price so you don't think that there is a tax.
- For hotels and restaurants services you pay another 10% service tax, kind of as an automatic tip.
- Tiping is completely to your discretion, but because of the 10% service tax in restaurants and hotels most people don't feel the need to tip, but if you are pleased with the service, feel free to leave a tip.
