MAY 16- MONOCHROME PRINT MEETING

Our speaker for the May 16 Monochrome Print meeting is Mr. Ramon Scavelli. Mr. Scavelli is a professional violist who has been with the National Symphony since 1960. His interest in photography goes back to 1955 when, at the age of 20, he joined the viola section of the Houston Symphony Orchestra under the leadership of the internationally celebrated conductor, Leopold Stokowski. What began as a hobby as now become a challenging profession, second only to his musical responsibilities. He is an active exhibitor, having had many one-man shows in the Washington, Northern Virginia, Maryland and New Jersey areas. His pictures have been seen in such magazines as the Washingtonian, Intellectual Digest, Washington Sunday Star, Life Magazine, Forecast F.M., and the New York Times. His pictures have also been published in Yehudi Mehunin's latest book. "Theme and Variations." He has done covers for the American Symphony Orchestra League Magazine, Symphony News, Music Educator's Journal and High-Fidelity-Musical America Magazine. Mr. Scavelli's photograph of conductor Antal Dorati is featured on the cover of the National Symphony Orchestra's recording of Tchaikovsky's 4th Symphony for London

GREATER WASHINGTON CAMERA CLUB COUNCIL 1974 SPRING COMPETITION

Deadline for entries to be submitted to club representative, Emerson Gray, at his home will be May 12, as they go to Council on May 13. Bring entries to Color meeting May 2nd if you can.

You may enter as many divisions as you wish, (Monochrome, Picture Story, Color Print, and Color Transparency.) The classes in the 4 divisions are:

Monochrome Division:

- (a) Small Print prints not more than 8 x 10", mounts not more than 16 x 20".
- (b) Intermediate Prints not more than 11 x 14", mounts not more than 16x20".
- (c) Unlimited Prints and mounts not more than 16 x 20".

Picture Story Division:

(a) More than one print mounted on one or more 16 x 20" boards. No single story to exceed 3 boards. No text or captions are permitted except for an overall title.

Color Print Division:

- (a) Small print prints not more than 8 x 10", mounts not more than 16 x 20".
- (b) Unlimited Prints and mounts not more than 16 x 20".

Color Transparency Division:

- (a) Pictorial
- (b) Nature
- (c) People and events (human interest and/ or photo-journalism).
- (d) Experimental (new techniques, manipulations, abstracts, etc.)
- (e) Novice (open only to those who have not had more than one honorable mention in GWCCC slide competitions.)

NOTE A competitor may submit 4 entries in each Class for which he is eligible. No entries previously accepted in a GWCCC competition may be resubmitted in that Division. Competitors may enter only one Class in each print division. Competitors may enter all classes in the color transparency division, except that only novices may enter

that class. All prints must be the work of the competitor.

FEES Entry fee shall be \$1.25 for each class entered.

picture your parks

PICTURE YOUR PARKS is a photography contest sponsored by The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission. It offers area camera buffs an opportunity to have their work judged, compete for awards and see their pictures displayed throughout Montgomery and Prince George's Counties.

The basic rule of PICTURE YOUR PARKS is that all entries must be photographs taken within the boundaries of the Park and Planning Commission's 28,000-acre, bi-county park system.

Here, photographers will find unlimited opportunities to be creative. The moods of the parks range from the quiet serenity of natural areas to the rollicking exuberance of active areas where both young and old share the fun of tennis, golf, archery, baseball, basketball, horseback riding, handball, horseshoes, hiking, biking, boating, fishing, skating, tobogganing and picnicking.

Adding to the fun and offering a host of pictorial possibilities are many special park features such as children's zoos, a miniature Mississippi River sternwheeler, the National Capital Trolley Museum, park lakes and an array of fanciful play equipment.

PICTURE YOUR PARKS is open to all residents of Montgomery and Prince George's Counties except employees of The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission. Contest entries will be divided into two age groups: Senior Division (age 17 and older) and Junior Division (age 16 and under).

Entries must be black and white or color prints of photographs taken since September, 1973, within the boundaries of any park or parkland in the M-NCPPC system. There is no limit to the number of entries that may be submitted by a single photographer. The maximum size of prints and/or mounts may not

exceed 11 X 14 inches and the minimum size shall not be less than 5 X 7 inches. No framed prints will be accepted. Color transparencies will not be accepted. No composites, "trick" photographs or multiple image prints will be accepted.

An official entry label including the photographer's name, address, telephone number, age group and title of the photograph must be securely affixed to the back of the print or mount. Neither the title of the picture nor the photographer's name shall appear on the face of the print or mount. Entry labels may be obtained, filled out and attached at any of the listed entry locations.

All entries must be received at one of the five locations by 5 p.m., on Friday, September 13, 1974.

All possible care will be exercised in the handling and exhibition of entries, but no responsibility will be assumed by the Commission for any losses or damage.

Those prints not selected for the traveling exhibit may be picked up at the location where they were entered beginning Tuesday, October 7.

Special arrangements will be made to return those prints selected for the PICTURE YOUR PARKS traveling exhibit.

Entries will be judged by a panel of professionals. Special emphasis in judging will be given to selecting those photographs which capture the spirit of the parks and illustrate photographic excellence.

The judges will select a Grand Award winner and First, Second, Third and Honorable Mention winners in each of the four divisions: Senior Color, Junior Color, Senior Monochrome (Black & White) and Junior Monochrome. In addition to the judges selections, awards will be presented for the Chairman's Choice (color), the Vice Chairman's Choice (monochrome), the Park Director's Award and the Commissioners' Favorite.

A reception and awards presentation will be held on Friday, September 27, at 7:30 p.m., in the auditorium of the Commission's Montgomery County Regional Office, 8787 Georgia Avenue, Silver Spring, Md. A complete showing of the entries will be on display at that time and the public is cordially invited to attend.

SPECIAL NOTE . . . In order to produce a PICTURE YOUR PARKS traveling exhibit featuring the award and honorable mention winners and such other prints as may be appropriate, the Commission reserves the right to use the submitted photograph for a period of eight months without cost.

The Commission further reserves the right to copy early entries for release to local newspapers.

PICTURE YOUR PARKS contestants may enter their prints at any of the following locations by not later than 5 p.m. on Friday, September 13, 1974.

SSCO Year-End Competition

The SSCC Year-end competition judging will be held this year on May 18, 1974. ALL entries must be in by the Monochrome Print meeting on May 16, 1974. Entries will be returned at the Banquet or may be picked up at Joe Davis' house after June 6, 1974. Awards for the competition and for SSCC Photographers of the Year will be presented at the Banquet. The rules for the year-end competition are basically the same as the rules for our monthly contests except that an individual may enter up to 5 slides and 5 prints. The results of the judging are confidential and no information will be given out prior to the Banquet. Three competent photographers will judge this competition and comment on the winning picture as they are shown at the Banquet. Photo may be entered only in the same class in which it competed during the year. If you are a Novice who has graduated into the Advanced class during this season, you may enter either the novice or advanced class for the year-end. You may not enter both! There will be 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and seven honorable mention awards given in each class. All slides or prints must have been entered during the year in SSCC Club competition or for SSCC in an interclub competition, or as a SSCC Club member in the All-Maryland, or GWCCC competition.
