EXHIBITION THE ART OF PHOTOGRAPHY

Regulations: 1) entrants must be members of a club affiliated with the People at Work: Patterns and Abstractions; Character Portraits; Humor; Stopped Motion; Parent and Child; The Baltimore Scene.

Maryland Council of Camera Clubs; 2) there is no limit on the number of entries; 3) prints must be mounted and show the considered; 4) mounts may not exceed 16x 20 but may range downward to 5x7 or smaller; 5) the Photo Stories and Four Seasons Essay categories are strictly for groups of pictures, but in the other categories several pictures may be mounted together; 6) prints may be entered for sale if desired with price marked on the back (10% commission to the JCC Art Fund); 7) closing date is May 5 and selections will be made May 18. All unsold work will be returned to the maker's club by June 30,

In connection with the opening of the exhibit on May 25 there will be a showing in the JCC auditorium of the accepted color slides from the 1969 Baltimore International Salon.
